the skills and support needed to move out of poverty. One workshop member, a single mother with 3 children, went from this workshop to a Royal Roads pre-employment program and is now in full-time business school.

Ford World Men's Curling Championships - Victoria, March 30 - April 7 2013

The 2013 Ford World Men's Curling Championships in Victoria will be an exciting, world class event at the Save-on Foods Arena, with 12 teams coming from the Americas, Europe and Asia Pacific and the Canadian team fresh from the Brier in Edmonton.

Peter Baillie introduced the speakers today, **Mr. Chris Atchison** and **Mr. Keith Dagg**, Co-Chairs of the Ford World Men's Curling Championship taking place March 30 to April 7 at the Save-On-Foods Memorial Centre. Service above self aptly describes these gentlemen. Chris was Vice Chair of the 2005 Ford World Men's Curling Championship, along with many other leadership roles in Curling and community sports.

Peter also introduced Keith Dagg, who has been honoured by the business community and the Tourism sector, with numerous accolades and awards. Keith was chair of the 2005 Ford World Curling Championships, and is well known for his dogged determination that has kept the Times Colonist/Island Savings Open golf tournament going for the past 32 years.

Chris Atchison started off the presentation by outlining the success of the 2005 Ford World Curling Championships in 2005 in Victoria - which Team Canada won. This event brought \$20 million to Victoria, with an unprecedented attendance of 116,000 and sellouts for 17 of the 21 draws. As a legacy the Curling Academy in Equimalt has introduced 120 students to curling since 2008.

The 2013 Ford World Men's Curling Championships in Victoria are anticipated to be even more exciting. Twelve men's teams are coming from the Americas, Europe and Asia Pacific. The Canadian team will be fresh from the Brier in Edmonton. Save-on Foods Arena offers a world-class facility for playing and viewing, improved this year with playback screens.

This event is seen as a springboard to the 2014 Sochi Olympics. Worldwide coverage is extensive, with direct feeds to Europe and Asia. As well as providing tremendous promotion to Victoria, it fills the March "sports" gap in Victoria.
