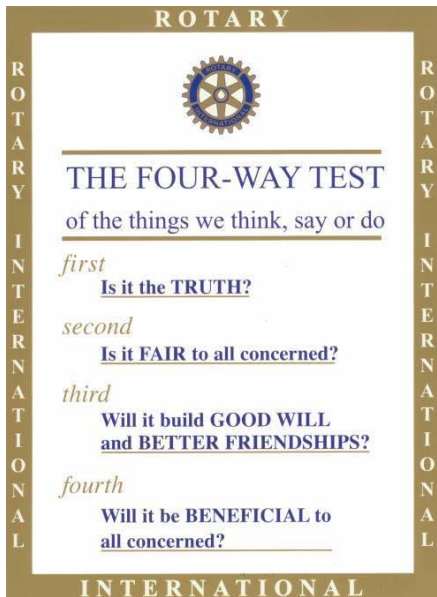

Rotary International

Rotary International includes a separate branch known as The Rotary Foundation. Each year, the Foundation provides millions for international scholarships, cultural exchanges; and, humanitarian projects large and small that improve the quality of life for millions of people locally and worldwide..

Rotary International is also committed to Polio Eradication, with the PolioPlus campaign. Rotary is committed to work with national and international health organizations with the goal of polio eradication. More than 1 billion children worldwide have been immunized against polio through the PolioPlus program and millions in 3 countries still need the vaccine for total eradication to be complete.

- Rotary Centennial project and fundraiser—sell spaces on new granite sidewalk and wall around historic fish pond ; expand park area & restore it after damage in 2008.

- Two annual Whitehall Rotary Stewart Way Memorial Scholarships to Whitehall Seniors
- Sponsor and fund Whitehall school students for a week at the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) summer camp.
