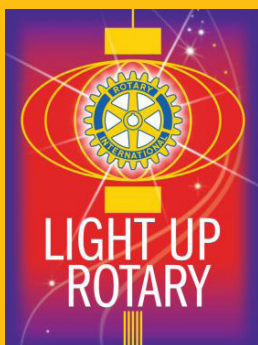

This Week's Program: Ryan Scott, Fish & Game State Wildlife Biologist



Ryan Scott currently serves as the Southeast Regional Supervisor for the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, Division of Wildlife Conservation; a position that allows him to work with bears throughout Southeast! Prior to his current position Ryan served as the Assistant Area Biologist and Area Biologist for northern Southeast Alaska, an area from Juneau north to Yakutat on the Gulf coast of Alaska, and regional management coordinator. As an Area Biologist, Ryan was responsible for the sustainable management of all game species in the northern panhandle. Ryan has led numerous bear management projects and assisted in several regional black and brown

bear research projects. Ryan's interests include hunting, fishing, working on a recently purchased project boat, and spending time with family and friends.
