Born and raised in Minnesota, Nancy moved to Juneau 15 years ago, sight unseen! A long-term *aficionado* of fine beers, Nancy helps the brewery communicate its message in many different ways -- from giving talks about the company, providing behind the scenes tours for visitors and coordinating special events, to managing the steady flow of donation requests for beer and merchandise the brewery receives each year. A member of the board of directors of the Juneau Convention & Visitors Bureau, Nancy serves as its secretary and treasurer.

Nancy loves dogs, and has represented the brewery at the Iditarod several times — one time accompanying one of the mushers down 4th Avenue in Anchorage! When she's not spreading the word about "all things beer", she likes to spend time with her husband Brian, and her two furry canine toddlers, Qimmiq (means 'dog' in Inupiat), and Montana, a retired Iditarod dog with 40,000 miles on her paws.



Nancy's presentation today will showcase the evolution of Alaskan Brewing Co's decades-long commitment to sustainable manufacturing processes in the brewing industry, which includes being the first craft brewery to recapture CO2. Most recently, the brewery launched its first-in-the-world spent grain boiler, which uses the spent grain by-product to generate power.


- Mark your calendars — roses will be delivered Thursday April 11. (No meeting on April 9 so people can help with zone deliveries on Thursday).
