

Van Nuys Rotary Foundation was made a member of the Fernando Award Foundation at their recent board of directors meeting. The Fernando Foundation oversees the process of awarding the Fernando Award, the highest award for volunteerism in the San Fernando Valley and is supported by the Valley Chambers of Commerce, other civic and philanthropic organizations, along with private individuals and corporations located in the San Fernando Valley. The emphasis is on recognizing and rewarding individuals who have dedicated their lives to community service and volunteerism. The Foundation also gives at least 11 college scholarships a year to local high school students.

June 1 Fundraiser

Pete reported that after expenses and winnings, our big event raised about \$6900 for projects. Interestingly, 9 of the 25 winning tickets, including the big prize, were sold by Zoraida, who earned a big round of applause for all her hard work.

SPEAKER: Dr. Barry Leonard

Mauricio introduced Dr. Barry Leonard, a former member of the Van Nuys club, and gave him a check to help support VOSH – Volunteer Optometry Services to Humanity, the group he now heads, and which held the eye clinic April 7 that many of us worked. There were also 15 wonderful optometry students from Pomona helping out, most of them students from other countries.

Barry thanked us again for our help with the clinic – more than 300 people of all ages were evaluated and given glasses, or referrals to physicians for disease, as needed. (there were 6 with conditions ranging from diabetes that had affected the eyes to glaucoma.) Those who needed prescriptions got their new glasses, in the frames of their choice, May 14.

Those 100 pairs of glasses were the hard work of Gianny Cardenas, a certified optician, and the only one on site that could properly measure where the focal points of the glasses needed to be. (Gianny is certified both with the American Board of Optometry and the Medical Board of California.) He works with Barry in Van Nuys making both glasses and contacts. He also made us laugh with his wry comments. Gianny and Barry enjoy putting their state-of-the art facilities to use – they love technology!

Through many cost-cutting measures and donations from labs, costs were kept to a minimum, which donations covered most of.

Thanks to the wonderful help and support of Mauricio and Ed (Viramontes), the clinic should be a semi-annual event at the New Economics for Women Center. PDG Les also asked if it might be set up in conjunction with the annual Health & Harvest Festival, held each October 31. They agreed to research the possibility.

Originally an east coast organization, VOSH came to California in 1983, working primarily in areas of Baja in Mexico, in conjunction with Lions and Rotary clubs there. About 10 years ago they started serving domestic needs, after Barry attended a Remote Area Medical event at an arena in Inglewood. He was astonished at the thousands of people waiting for the free clinic, and realized there is a great need for medical services of all kinds in our own communities.

In addition to VOSH, Barry is chair of the Greater San Fernando Valley Chamber of Commerce, a job he'll be turning over to Maria Sanchez next year. To contact Barry, call 818-891-6711, or visit www.drbleonard.com.


