RC Ojai had transferred \$4,000 of our assigned share of DDF to support this cause. 18 villages in one of the poorest areas of Honduras will be part of a community micro credit banking program. This type of program is one of the purest examples of sustainability and will in a very real way help villagers who live on \$1 or \$2 per day.

We saw 550 patients on the island providing general medical care and prescription medications donated by the Medicine Shoppe of Ojai, Rexall Drugs, and Community Memorial Hospital of Ventura. We provided a full gamut of medical care for all ages. We met with the newly established Rotary Club of Roatan, local community leaders, and church groups to foster networking and improvement of medical services. We also donated \$500 to the Ojai West water project in Guatemala that will produce water catchment equipment and filtration by Tulip Filters for families at a reasonable cost.

Ojai Rotarian doctor (Dr. Skankey) planned to go, but couldn't because of visa problems.
