The CBCS offers family and social services support to the local and broader community. A key component of their program is the inter-generational project which offers mentorship opportunities for young and old. There is also a child minding service as part of their summer programs, Family Camp for low income families and single parents. Parent education and support is also an important part of the program. Supported adult camps of 1 week duration are popular also.

The services are supported by service clubs, the Ministry of Children and Families and the United Way. They are offered to the community of the Peninsula but also more broadly within the lower mainland for some events and program. There are more than 70 active volunteers and over 50 part time and full time employees running the programs.
