Rotary Club of White Rock Millennium President Elect **Pat Hahn** attended our meeting to introduce our membership to the White Rock Rotary Service Foundation. He was assisted by Rotarian **Bob Shumka** and Rotarian **Jeff Richards**.

The Foundation, formerly knows as the Queen of Hearts Foundation, is now over 10 years old and has over \$28,000 earning funds which are distributed to the four originating and partnering clubs. It is a Rotary Community Foundation like others which have been very successful in Calgary and in the lower mainland.

Benefits to the community include that is is a permanent fund (the capital is not used), it generates funds for local initiatives, and it has low administration costs.

Benefits to the Rotarian includes

- opportunity for Rotarian's to leave a legacy to the Club and the Community, in the name of the donor if desired.
- it is a permanent endowment
- it is a local choice for gifting

Benefits to Non-Rotarians include:

- minimal administration costs are involved


Contributions can include:

Rotary club members of WhiteRockPeninsula are seeking four outstanding professionals to visit Ecuador in April, 2009 as part of the Group Study Exchange program of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

Through the program, teams of young professionals from two different countries exchange visits. For four to six weeks, team members experience the way of life, customs, and vocational practises of another country, while sharing information about their homeland.

The purpose of the Group Study Exchange program is to promote international understanding and goodwill through personal connection. While abroad, team members stay in Rotarians' homes and have the opportunity to meet their professional counterparts. The Rotary Foundations pays for round-trip airfare, and the Rotary club members in the host country provide meals, lodging, and group travel in their district. Team members pay for personal and incidental expenses.

Young adults between the ages of 25 and 40 who are interested in applying should be employed full-time in a business of profession. Applicants must live or be employed in district 5050 which encompasses the Fraser Valley in British Columbia, Canada and the North-Western state of Washington, USA.
