Our final week of service in eastern Guatemala began with a visit to the Castillo de San Fillipe, a 16th century fortress built to protect the Spanish commercial interests from Carribbean pirates (say "Johnny Depp"!).

It is now a national park and a beautiful place to spend an afternoon in the land of eternal spring.

We offered treatment at the base clinic and then moved the mobile clinic twice to finish the month. Altogether, as McDonald's would say: "Over 350 patients served" with more than 750 individual treatment services completed.

Our return to Guatemala City was almost 6 hours with Domingo expertly threading his way around insane Guatemalan drivers in 40+ temperatures. Better to leave the driving to the professionals! Israel came with us this time: he will be exposed to some continuing education regarding a prevention program which is in the works.

We met Mr. Jurg Egli, who has volunteered with the project for 20 years, and also knows the best steak houses in Guatemala City. As the project evolves, it was good to offer our impressions of the last month of service to him.
