



Approved Topeka Rotary Foundation Cup Money Projects, 2018-2019

- August 2018 **Grace Med**, local health clinic , for renovating its building in central Topeka serving lower income neighborhood residents.
- September 2018 Anti-Human Trafficking, providing **Fresh Start Kits** to 2000 victims in the Topeka area. This is a joint project of four Topeka Rotary clubs each contributing \$500.
- October 2018 **Guatemala International Service Project**, buying paint and supplies for the school and clinic our club helped in July. The allocation is \$600 toward a joint project with the Topeka South Rotary Club.
- November 2018 Kansas Children’s Service League’s **Center for Restorative Education**, a project serving Shawnee County youth who have been expelled or long-term suspended by schools in the county.
- December 2018 **Christmas Bureau** (United Way of Greater Topeka) provides holiday assistance for those in need.
- January 2019 **Logan Elementary School**, Annie Adams, School Nurse. Request is for head lice treatment and supplies. A previous grant has concluded and these families, some of the poorest in the district have no money to pay for lice treatment and nit combs.
- February 2019 **Wonderful Works Deliverance Center** is located at 815 SW 5th street in central Topeka. They requested funds for their after-school program where they feed about 30 children daily during the school year and have a summer camp for 10 weeks where they offer 3 meals per day. Most of their children attend Meadows elementary. This is a church-supported program.
- March 2019 **Hope and Healing Academy** is an equine-facilitated psychotherapy program that works with 60 clients ages 7 to 70. Program is supported by donations for scholarships for clients and food for the horses. \$25 provides therapy for a client; \$7 feeds a horse for a day.
- April 2019 **Jayhawk Area Boy Scout Council** for camp scholarships for summer, 2019. Camp scholarships provide up to 50% of the cost of day camp or resident camp.
- May 2019 **Topeka Library Foundation** for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library literacy program for children birth through age 5. This program will allow 14 children to participate and be ready for kindergarten. Each enrolled child gets in the mail a free age-appropriate book every month.
