LAST MEETING: 3/7/12

Club President **ANDY DLINN** called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by **JIM LUDWIG** who thanked the Lord for the good works that Rotarians are doing around the world. The pledge and song were led by **ALAN McIVOR**. We sang by memory “This Is My County,” accompanied by the nimble fingers of **JIM HALL** at the piano. **JIM LUDWIG** filled in for Secretary **MARGARET DeLEEuw**. He told us about four things he did last week that made him proud to be a Rotarian; the main one being the Ethics Symposium which was held at Duquesne University last Wednesday.

MIKE COLELLA, a Credit Analyst for Citizens’ Bank, had his three minutes of fame and asked some True/False questions about his life experiences.

Denny Crawford, Past District Governor, introduced Cat Sheane from the Pittsburgh GSE Team, which is going to South Korea this May. Cat told us about some of the things they plan to do in Korea and thanked us for helping sponsor the group’s forthcoming trip.

BOB FRAGASSO then introduced our speaker, Jay Speyerer, owner of Legacy Road Communications, whose presentation was about body language. Jay

told us that body language basically originates in the back of the brain and results in natural body motions, not ones that are intentional. He talked about unintentional physical indicators which, for an example, is a person speaking and rubbing his nose at the same time. This is an indication that what the person is in fact saying is actually a lie because his hand is trying to cover up his mouth while he is giving his talk. Other such indicators are folded arms across ones chest to indicate hostility or a negative reaction. He said that one should not be nervous to speak to an audience because basically the audience is on your side because they really don’t want to be up there making your presentation. So, consequently, they do not want you to fail. The one thing one shouldn’t do in a presentation is use the word “uh.” A reflective pause is much better than “uh” or, as the athlete’s use, “you know.” “When giving a presentation,” a Rotarian asked, “what should you do with your hands?” His recommendation would be to hold your hands at your side. You could put one hand in your pocket but not both. He said that whenever making a presentation you should always try to stand tall. His example was his own mother, who was 4’11”, who claimed she was tall – not short.

ANDY then closed the meeting with the recital of the Rotary Four-Way Test.
