Now to the "Main Event": The candidates for the hottest race in town, the Allegheny County Executive seat. The contenders took center stage to inform, educate and inspire our members.

On May 17, Allegheny County Democrats will choose between former County Council President Rich Fitzgerald of Squirrel Hill and County Controller Mark Patrick Flaherty of Mt. Lebanon. The Republican primary candidates are former County Councilman Chuck McCullough of Upper St. Clair and Mt. Lebanon Commissioner D. Raja. This primary election features a deep pool of candidates, with no incumbent on the ballot. Dan Onorato's replacement will face many difficult challenges, including property reassessments, transportation funding problems, mounting deficits and the continued talk of city-county consolidation. Candidates skillfully discussed issues that ranged from stimulating our local economy through the growth of jobs; retaining our youth for the local workforce; budget deficits; the funding of Port Authority; repeal of the "drink tax"; revisiting the home charter rule; privatization of the Pittsburgh International airport; business and high technology investment in our region and tax reform.

All four candidates agreed that the next county executive should support Marcellus Shale reserves beneath county property to generate revenue and to create jobs. Differences in planning and implementation for Marcellus Shale development were discussed, even though all four men support the drilling as a regional economic driving force.

There are few traditions more central to political campaigns than debates between the candidates. In national races, we are accustomed to nationally televised debates that journalists and the public anxiously cover. On our local level, community gatherings where business leaders are able to get to know their wouldbe leaders are essential. A big thanks to Andy Dlinn for bringing us together with the candidates,

addressing the issues facing our county and our future ahead.


