Lisa Mueller, a Rotarian from the Long Island and Hollywood areas presented a “green” project that she is representing. She is looking for our club, as a whole, or as individual members to participate financially. The Global Alternative Energy Alliance is her project. The organization’s mission is to promote the adoption of these kinds of energy and foster these success stories in every community. The group is attempting to fund construction of an Alternative Energy Education Center, which will be 100% powered by solar, wind, and geothermal energy. This is where families can learn about how to make sustainable alternative energy a part of their homes and lives. A location has not yet been chosen.

Dr. Paul Scerri then presented a project he is developing at CMU utilizing small, fan boats to skim small bodies of water to determine oxygen saturation and cleanliness. The boats are developed with robotic technology and google phones. They are currently looking at a locally-based river application for testing fracking water.
