Then it was on to **Richard Dixon** introducing his long time friend, and our speaker of the day, John "Jack" Lee, President of Strategists, Inc. Here are a few notes regarding Mr. Lee's presentation. Jim started off his presentation by outlining some key populations statistics of the Boomer, X, Y and what he calls the "Thumbs" generation. ("Thumbs" connotation is for the generation that is texting and gaming.) He then proceeded to talk about the differences and difficulties that occur in the work place due to the significant differences between the generations.

- 1) Current generations learn via internet vs. the older generation that typically learned from talking to their parents or elders
- 2) The US currently has 300 million people, India 1.2 million and China 1.4 million.
- 3) The populations reveal that we have significant issues in remaining intellectually strong and therefore need to find ways to work better, more intelligently together
- 4) As we have moved through the generations, we have progressed through many phases of "work place relationships," moving from autocratic work places to the current day of working in flexible teams
- 5) We have also moved from an agricultural society, to an industrial society to the current "intelligence society"
- 6) Generation Y-ers want social networking at work and outside of work, want a flexible schedule and are willing to work 24/7 passionately if it is at THEIR will not the company's will
