Polio Fundraiser—Aaron Babcock has contributed Husker Illustrated yearbooks to be sold at \$10 apiece as a fundraiser for Polio with 100% of the proceeds benefitting the End Polio Now Campaign as well as other activities of Lincoln South Rotary.

End Polio Now Event—Nicki Klein reported Lincoln is very close to its goal for raising its portion of the \$200 million Challenge Grant to Rotary International from the Bill Gates. To raise the remainder of the funds, the Lincoln Rotary Clubs have scheduled a "Strike Out Polio" event at the Salt Dogs game on August 19th. Tickets for the club section behind home plate will be \$16 each with 1/2 of the proceeds going to polio eradication. The goal is to sell 243 tickets which is the capacity of the club section. There also will be opportunities to qualify to throw out the first pitch. See page 4 for Flyer with details.

Rotary 107 — In 2008 when Rotary was 104 years old, the District Governor challenged all members to be active by awarding points for participation. Anyone with 104 points or more by the end of March of that Rotary year was awarded with a special Rotary 104 lapel pin. The challenge is on again this year with Rotary 107. Dr. Tyler White, Director of Academic Programs for the Great Plains National Security Education Consortium was our speaker on Friday. The consortium was created between UNL, UNO, Creighton and Bellevue University with a mission to familiarize students with the intelligence commu-

nity (IC). The IC is made up of many agencies including FBI, CIA. Homeland Security & NSA which are all located primarily Washington DC. As a result most students in other parts of the country are not familiar with the IC and most of the people working in

the field are from the DC area. The Director of National Intelligence (DNI) wants to expand recruiting for these agencies to other areas of the US.

The program does a number of things to get students interested in the IC including skills development, resume writing and helping them determine what they need to do to get a Conditional Offer of Employment. They have taken students to DC

at no cost to visit agencies to find out what they do. They also have brought representatives from various IC agencies to Nebraska to speak to students. Internships in the agencies are very competitive and several students from the program are now interning at IC agencies.

> This vear they did a week long summer workshop with students from 15 schools who participated in career mentoring and seminars. They set up a scenario of a nuclear created Iran and pieces of intelligence

for the students to piece together.

The program received a commendation from the DNI this year for the great work they have done. Nebraska is the only such program in this part of the US.

Future plans include doing more High School outreach and doing a summer camp with UNO.
