Guest Speaker: John Todor - Christchurch Earthquake

The guest speaker was John Todor, who is the Commander of the Specialist Response Division of the Police force. He talked to us about the recent police deployment in Christchurch in response to the earthquake. This was a very humanitarian deployment which was very different to the

peace keeping deployments that they normally do.

John commenced by comparing the September 2010 and February 2011 earthquakes. The September quake was a magnitude of 7.1. It struck 40km west of Christchurch and was 10km deep. While the city and surrounding suburbs suffered damages to buildings and infrastructure, there were no fatalities. In comparison, the February quake was 6.3 magnitude, however it caused much more damage and deaths because it was only 10km from Christchurch and 5km deep. One third of the city was destroyed, and the entire CBD was cordoned off. The eastern suburbs were reduced to third world conditions.

From the time that Howard Broad, the NZ Police Commissioner, contacted the Australian police commissioners (Victoria, NSW, SA and Federal) for assistance, it took 48 hours to mobilise 100 Australian police officers, deploy them to Christchurch and have them 'sworn in' to patrol Christchurch (the first time in 170 years that Australian police had patrolled the streets of NZ). John shared many photos of the devastated city, showing how life had just stopped in the CBD - a surreal feeling for the 2nd largest city in NZ.

Initially, the Australian officers were involved in patrolling the streets, but later were given charge of the deployments for the cordons of community, reassuring policing in the urban areas and civic rescue works. This allowed the Christchurch police to get on with their strategic planning as to how they were going to rebuild.

On their days off, the Australian police would volunteer in the communities, helping clean up homes and rebuild. One of the main challenges the deployment encountered was navigating the different industrial relations awards of the states involved. This, John said, was something that will need to be addressed by the organisations and how they work together in the future.

At the end of their deployment, the Australian police handed over \$15,000 that they raised from the sale of T-shirts to the Christchurch 'rebuilding fund'. The contribution of the Australian deployment was extremely appreciated by Christchurch.

At the time of publishing this item, our small team will have left for Japan to arrive in Osaka on 4th April.

The main purpose of the visit was to attend the 20th



Anniversary of our Sister Club - RC Osaka Hommachi. 

Following the enormous tragedy inflicted on northern Japan by the earthquake and tsunami, they have cancelled their celebration but our team will still attend their normal weekly meeting and pay our respects. Osaka is over 250km south of Tokyo and 500km south of the major impact areas and considered safe to travel.

The team of Paul and Harumi Maguire, Herb and Leonie Greenwood and John and Lorraine Meehan fly direct to Osaka whilst Kevin and Veronica Love will meet them there at the end of a private tour. The remaining members, Frank and Pauline O'Brien will join the party at Osaka on 4th April also but following their 3 week tour of mainland China.

Highlights of the tour will include Hiroshima, Nara Park and Kyoto (4 days) and Takayama. Some of the team have decided to shorten their tour by two days to avoid Tokyo and its surrounds in the light of the Australian Government travel warnings. Great feelings of sorrow and compassion will be extended by our Team on behalf of all our members to our fellow Rotarians in Japan.
