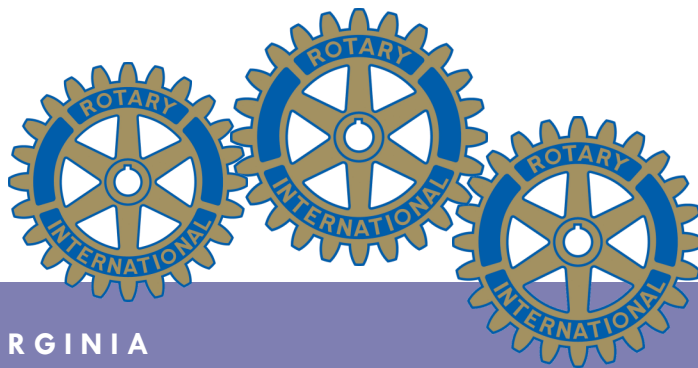

Assistant District Governor Rohrbaugh Visits Ashburn

James Rohrbaugh is currently the Chief Growth Officer at Inova Loudoun. In this role Mr. Rohrbaugh has responsibility for the growth and expansion of Inova Loudoun including the Leesburg Campus as well as new services in Purcellville, Lovettsville, and Dulles South. He also has oversight for guest services (food and environmental), security, plant operations, physical medicine and rehabilitation as well as the 100-bed Loudoun Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

Mr. Rohrbaugh has served in a variety of leadership roles since joining Loudoun Hospital in 1988. These roles have included serving as the Chief Information Officer, Corporate Controller, Payroll Manager and several other roles in the finance department. From the period of 1998 – 2001, he left Loudoun Hospital and served as a Manager in the Healthcare Consulting Practice of PricewaterhouseCoopers, LLP where he provided healthcare consulting services to over 35 hospitals across the United States.



He has a Bachelor's in Business Administration from Shenandoah University and is a Certified Public Accountant in Virginia. He was one of the first two students invited by the Mayor of Moscow to study International Business at the International University in Moscow, Russia. He has completed graduate work in health-care administration at the University of North Carolina. He has served on numerous community boards including Leadership Loudoun, the Loudoun Credit Union, and the Loudoun Community Health Center. He is a Past President and active member of the Leesburg Daybreak Rotary Club. He currently serves as the Assistant District Governor for Rotary and is a previous recipient of the Rotarian of the Year for the Leesburg Daybreak Rotary Club. He is a 2003 graduate of Leadership Loudoun.

Mr. Rohrbaugh is the past Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Loudoun County Chamber of Commerce. He has been an active member of the Loudoun Chamber of Commerce for the last five years and a Board Member for the last four where he has served as the First Vice Chair, Second Vice Chair, and VP of Technology. He was honored in 2005 with a Volunteer Leadership Award by the Chamber. He has served on the Loudoun County Economic Development Commission.

Mr. Rohrbaugh grew up in western Loudoun County and resides today on a small farm in Lucketts with his wife Julie, son Alex, and daughter Natalie. Julie serves as the Deputy Commissioner of Revenue for the County of Loudoun. In James' free time he can be found enjoying photography, climbing mountains, spending time at the barn or at a horse show with his daughter and her pony, or at his son's soccer games.

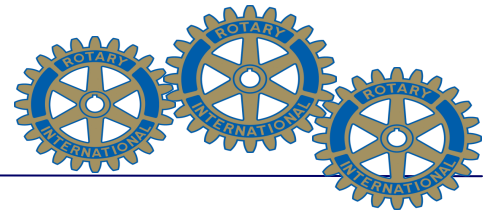

Fundraising

Great ideas and boundless enthusiasm are wonderful resources to have, but your project won't be effective if it doesn't have the money to make it viable. Fundraising requires a plan that spells out what your club wants to accomplish through the project and how the club expects to get the money to make it work. You might be able to finance a project completely through fundraising events, such as a charity dinner, celebrity auction, walk-athon, arts and crafts sale, bake sale, or car wash. Other times, you'll need to turn to outside funding sources, which may include:

- Individuals
- Businesses
- Foundations (including The Rotary Foundation)
- Nonprofit or nongovernmental organizations
- Government agencies
- Other Rotary clubs
