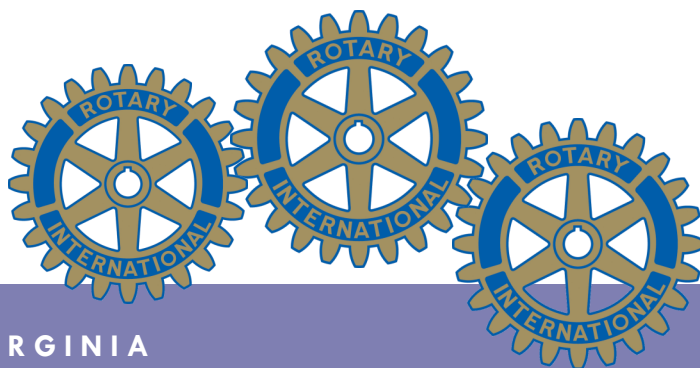

The Rotary Club of Ashburn Welcomes Kathy Griffin.

Our presenter today is Kathy Griffin, -- the Other Kathy Griffin, who is not at all on Hollywood's "D List"!

Kathy is a financial literacy educator and advocate, long before "financial literacy" became the Googlable term it is today. The recent crash and its continuing aftershocks dramatically demonstrated that it's in our national interest to raise financially self-sufficient citizens. Kathy's current, and second, venture is a social enterprise dedicated to helping young adults become financially competent to manage their student loans, credit cards, bank accounts, and savings plans.

She and her team have created MoneyU, an award-winning web-based game that teaches financial skills to young adults 17-25. It is used in high schools, colleges, training organizations and homes. MoneyU won Tech&Learning's *Award of Excellence*, "one of the best education offerings of 2008." Her talk today will include a peek at the game.

Before Money U, Kathy co-founded COMSYS Technical Services Inc, an IT Staffing company that was nationally recognized as a leading provider by its peers in the National Association of Computer Consultant Businesses (NACCB), and in the *Inc 500*, in 1989, 1990 and 1991, as one the fastest growing privately-held companies in America.

Kathy has long-appreciated the value of online, just-in-time training. A key to COMSYS' enormous success was a big commitment to employee training. She designed online training and decision-support tools, which were an important factor for several buyout offers. In 1994, at nearly 2000 employees, COMSYS was sold to Corestaff (MetaMor), and Kathy "retired" to parenting full-time her two children, then 8 and 5.

Kathy served 17 years, three as President, on the Board of the Parent Encouragement Program (PEP), an education nonprofit that provides parenting classes in the greater Washington area. She became an advocate for financial literacy among young people by leading popular workshops for many years there, for parents to learn effective ways to financially train their children. Wanting to reach a greater audience, she developed MoneyU, to deliver practical skills directly to young adults.

Kathy has also founded the Center for Financial Literacy, a non-profit whose mission is to bring financial literacy programs to underserved and at-risk youth.

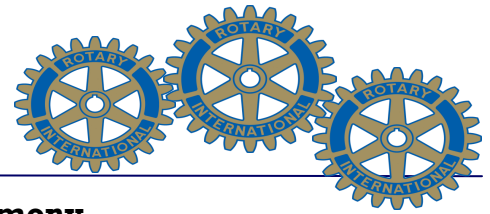
