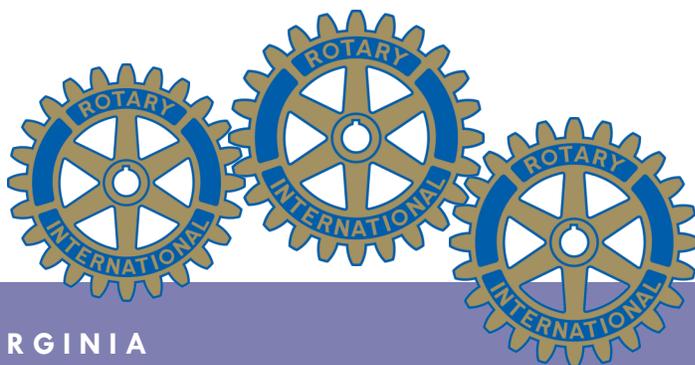

## Rotary Welcomes John Andrews of Green Energy Partners

Green Energy Partners was formed to build a Greenpeace-recommended, clean power facility. No longer does Loudoun County need to rely on yesterday's coal technology. We can do better, and that's why Green Energy Partners is proposing an energy solution that will power a better tomorrow.

In February, Loudoun County-based Green Energy Partners announced plans to build an environmentally friendly, clean and renewable green energy-generating facility that will launch Loudoun County towards becoming energy independent.

At that time, Green Energy Partners filed a proposal with the Loudoun County government to build an approximately \$800 million hybrid energy facility that would use effluent water from the Town of Leesburg sewage treatment plant in a natural gas fired power plant plus what would be Virginia's largest photovoltaic solar array to provide the region with a green energy alternative.

Green Energy Partners is a local business. John Andrews has teamed with his father Jack Andrews to form Green Energy Partners, a Loudoun-based limited liability company to assist Loudoun County in taking control of its own energy future.

John has been active in the community for years, having served as chairman of the Loudoun County School Board as a representative of the Potomac District and currently as a Board Member for the Blue Ridge Speech and Hearing Center. Professionally, John has dedicated his time and resources to unique projects that have benefitted Loudoun County. John worked with county staff and elected officials to create the county's first active-adult community, seeing a need at the time for Loudoun County to create a comfortable atmosphere for the area's seniors. Also, John was directly involved with the county's first affordable housing program.

All of John's efforts have been in his own backyard. John's reputation—and ability to bring fresh ideas and innovative solutions to Loudoun County—is supported by his track record of working with all community members and local officials to provide first-class projects to his neighborhood.

## The Four-Way Test



More than 24,000 children will die today. More than 850 children will die in the time it takes most of us to mow our lawns this weekend. Forty will die while you read this message.
