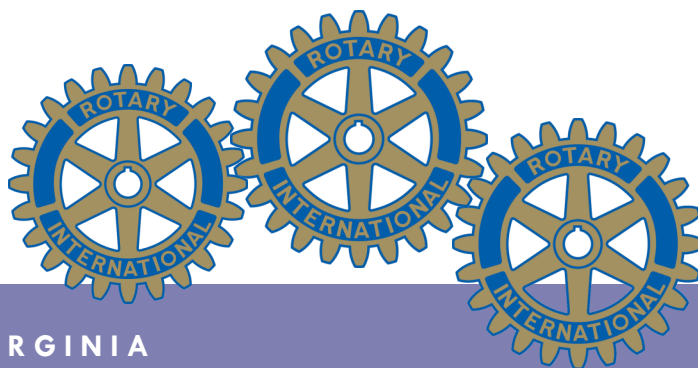

Patricia Phillips, Candidate for State Senate to Speak

When she was a young child, Patricia's family moved to McLean, Virginia. She was educated in the local public school system, graduating from Langley High School in 1975. Following high school, she enrolled at Drexel University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, earning a bachelors degree in Nutrition Science.

After graduating from college, Patricia married her High School sweetheart, Chris Phillips. She began working for the Fairfax County Public School System, supervising lunch programs at Churchill Road, Weyanoke and Oakton Elementary schools.

Several years later, she accepted a position with the Department of Agriculture, in the office responsible for regulating school lunch programs. In 1985, she founded Phillips Resources to help food companies make their products both more nutritious, and more suitable for school lunch programs. Her experience in helping government and industry work together to solve problems was useful in her development into an effective leader and community advocate.

Patricia first became involved in the legislative process by serving as the State Director for a large non-profit group focused on advancing family and educational issues. She quickly became disappointed by the lackluster effort of long-time politicians to voice concerns against harmful legislation. The needs of everyday Virginians were being set aside in favor of partisan politics. Seeing a real need, Patricia decided to make a difference. She decided to run for State Senate.

In 2007, Patricia waged a competitive campaign as a first-time candidate against incumbent trial lawyer Mark Herring, who received a large portion of funds from Planned Parenthood and other special interest groups. She garnered 43 percent of the vote, while being outspent eight to one in the general election. Although disappointed after losing a close race, Patricia remained steadfast in her service to various community groups in Loudoun and Fairfax Counties.

This past year, Patricia served as chairwoman of the Loudoun Crime Commission. She is also a member of the Loudoun Chamber of Commerce, Toastmaster's International, the National Association of Professional Women, and the American Commodity Distribution Association, from whom she received their outstanding service award.

Additionally, in recognition of her superior service on behalf of families in Virginia, former Governor James Gilmore presented her with the Patrick Henry Award.

Patricia has been married to her husband Chris since 1979. They live in Sterling, Virginia, with their two daughters, Virginia and Beth. The Phillips family attends Potomac Falls Anglican Church weekly, where they are all active members.



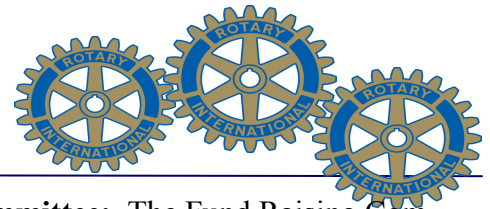
