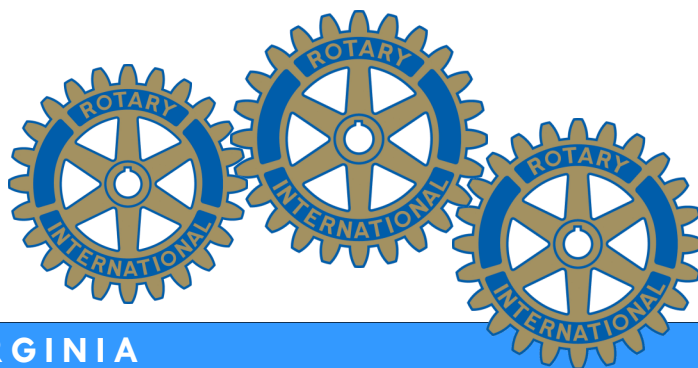

Loudoun Cares arrived on the local nonprofit scene in 2003 with a couple of board members, \$600 dollars and an ambitious vision to strengthen local nonprofits and develop a nonprofit center. The center will provide affordable, stable and mission enhancing office space for local nonprofits. Since that time, Loudoun Cares has initiated and maintained the local Information & Referral Helpline, Claude Moore Community Builders youth volunteerism initiative and nonprofit board development training. Loudoun Cares is now a leading voice advocating for our local nonprofit community and the residents that we serve.

In 2009, far from our humble beginnings, Loudoun Cares purchased the property at 207 King Street in Leesburg. While fundraising continues and extensive renovations are still to be accomplished, a small part of the property now serves as home to several local nonprofits. We continue to look to the community for broad-based support to help us finish what we have started – the development of nonprofit infrastructure that will benefit our community for the next 50 years and beyond.

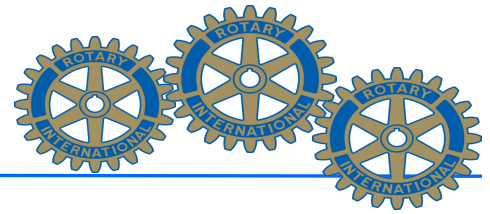

The Loudoun Cares Nonprofit Center

In 2009, Loudoun Cares purchased the property located at 207 King Street in Leesburg. Development of the Loudoun Cares Nonprofit Center – a facility where office space will be provided for at least a dozen local health and human service nonprofits is a work in progress. While a small portion of the facility has been renovated and serves as home to several nonprofit organizations, extensive renovations must still be completed for the building to achieve full potential.

Upon completion, the Loudoun Cares Nonprofit Center will provide:

Stability – local community-based organizations will be cushioned against the fluctuation of the commercial real estate market and spend their rent dollars on a facility created by and for nonprofits.

Affordability – tenant nonprofits will pay rents that are well below market rates, thus allowing them to spend less on overhead and more on programs and services.

Community – our center will bring nonprofits together under one roof, increasing their visibility, promoting program synergies reducing duplication of service and facilitating joint community initiatives.

Economic Development – the Center will serve as a hub of economic activity with staff who are local consumers and clients who receive training, services and support.
