Getting the Best Out of Getting Out of Business.

This week members enjoyed a talk from author and business consultant Simon Frayne. Mike Prosser gave a dynamic introduction to Simon's talk, which was based on his soon to be released book 'Formula 1 for Business'. In his book and his talk this evening Simon reported that over the next few years 80,000 business will go on the market as *baby boomers* head for retirement. This means that markets will be competitive and potential sellers will need to "get all their ducks in a row". This prompted the question "what makes a successful business" to which Simon suggested five strategies; vision, strategy, clients returning, costs control and efficiency. Simon also spent some time discussing how businesses could increase their appeal by incorporating 15 pillars of values (outlined in his book). In closing, Simon gave a poignant quote that 'businesses should be for sale all the time'.

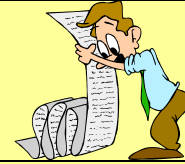
