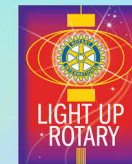

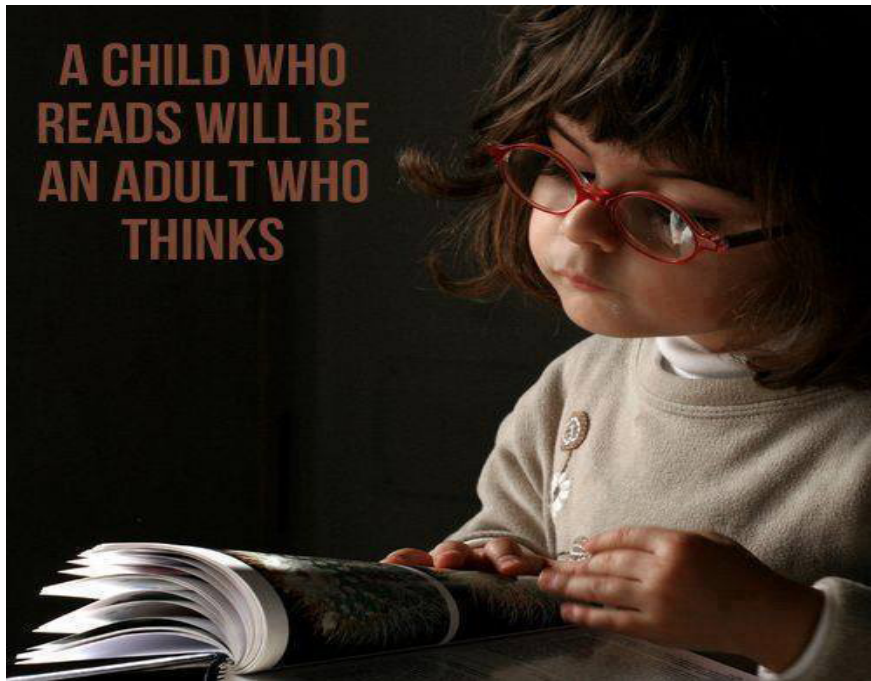

Last Week



Sheriff Dean Growden spoke last week about changes resulting from the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act passed by voters. Former drug and burglary felonies are now misdemeanors, and law enforcement responses are radically changed as a result of reduced sentences for new offenders and releases for those in jail for those offenses. Lassen County recently had 42% in jail on narcotics offenses, and now has 0%. Sheriff Growden also spoke about a grant recently awarded for \$220,000/year to address good decision-making among school children.
