Susan Quale, VP of Human Resources at Sierra Cascade Nursery, noted in last week's presentation that SCN grows root stock, nothing for market. Of the 2,400 employees, 50% are on an H2A work visa from Mexico, and the company uses E-Verify to ensure that every hire is legal. The H2A workers must be temporary/seasonal, must not displace domestic workers, and pay federal and state tax if they meet requirements.
