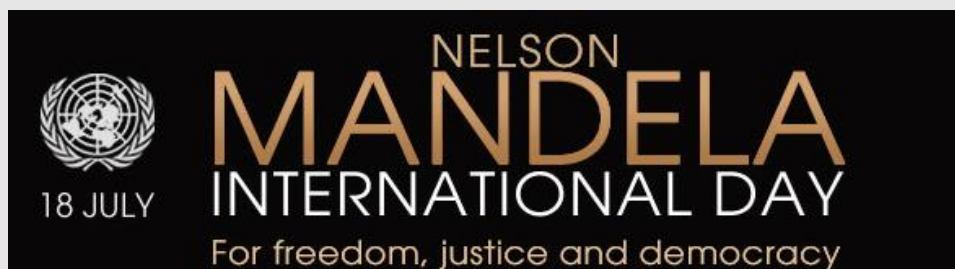

United Nations Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela Prize

The United Nations Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela Prize is an honorary award to be presented once every five years as a tribute to the outstanding achievements and contributions of two individuals (one female and one male).

The aim of the Prize, which will be awarded for the first time in 2015, is to recognize the achievements of those who dedicated their lives to the service of humanity while honouring and paying homage to Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela’s extraordinary life and legacy of reconciliation, political transition and social transformation.

The inaugural laureates, who will receive their awards in New York on 24 July 2015, are:

Dr Helena Ndume (Namibia)

Dr Helena Ndume is an ophthalmologist whose life's work has been the treatment of blindness and eye-related illnesses, both in Namibia and throughout the developing world. Born in Namibia, she lived in exile in Zambia, Gambia and Angola before studying medicine in Germany at the University of Leipzig, where she received her PhD in 1989.

Upon completing her medical internship at Katutura Hospital and Windhoek Central Hospital in Namibia, she returned to Germany to specialize in ophthalmology at the University of Saarland. She spent part of her field studies in Tamil Nadu, India, where she participated in outreach services in eye care for the first time.

To date, Dr Ndume has helped over 30,000 Namibians receive no-cost eye surgery and intraocular lens implants addressing blindness, cataracts, and myopia. She currently serves as Head of Ophthalmology at the Windhoek Central Hospital and has received numerous international honours.



H.E. Mr. Jorge Fernando Branco Sampaio (Portugal)

Born in 1939, Jorge Fernando Branco Sampaio graduated in Law from Lisbon University in 1961. As elected head of the Students' Union of the Lisbon Law Faculty, he became a leader in the struggle for the restoration of democracy in Portugal, which was eventually achieved through the Carnation Revolution (1974) and the establishment of a liberal democratic constitutional regime in 1976.

In the 1960s and early 1970s, Mr. Sampaio took numerous cases to the courts of the dictatorship, defending political prisoners and exposing the abuses of the police. He defended, on a pro bono basis, several victims of state repression. From 1976 onwards, Mr. Sampaio became a consistent supporter of the consolidation of Portuguese democracy: as a Member of Parliament and, from 1996 to 2006, as President of Portugal.

As the UN Secretary-General's first Special Envoy to Stop Tuberculosis from 2006 to 2012, Mr. Sampaio has raised the international visibility of the scale of the disease and its impact on achievement of the Millennium Development Goals. As the UN High Representative for the Alliance of Civilizations from 2007 to 2013, appointed by Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, he set up an important UN forum for dialogue and cooperation against hatred and violence and promoted common action at local, national and regional levels to meet the challenges of cultural diversity across the globe.

... When schools are closed there is no school feeding, so the children are hungry and all they really have are the streets. Then, of course they are faced with added challenges of gangs, drugs and violence. That is why the Centre is such a valuable program and needs to continue operating especially during the school holidays...

This is what we require and use each month:

Rice, spaghetti/pasta, samp and beans, dried soup mix, tinned pilchards, stock cubes, sachets tomato puree, cooking oil.

I certainly do not expect anyone to supply a meals worth of ingredients, but as a guide we use 12 packets of spaghetti (500g) per meal, or 12 tins of fish, or 10kg rice, etc... I have naturally only suggested dried foodstuffs, but I do buy bulk sausage, mince and chicken necks as protein and include carrots, butternut, cabbage, onions as veg.

Speaker

Jenny Ibbotson introduced Maggie Golding, the two Makaton tutors from the UK and the four Makaton trainee tutors.

Maggie has long been involved with the education of children with severe communication and learning difficulties and was instrumental in organising the recent workshop to train local Makaton tutors with the help of overseas tutor trainers. She explained the history and need for Makaton, a language programme program using signs and symbols to help people to communicate. It is designed to support spoken language and the signs and symbols are used with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear. Using symbols can help people who have limited speech and those who cannot, or prefer not to sign. For a long time she has been the only registered Makaton tutor in South Africa and there is a great need to train South African tutors to meet the local demand and make Makaton accessible to many more people.

The four trainee tutors each in turn briefly spoke on their training and their plans and hopes for the future.

Bill Holland thanked the speakers.

- Jenny Ibbotson: Looking for a second-hand laptop; reminder of International and Vocational committee meeting next week; and call for bursary applications.

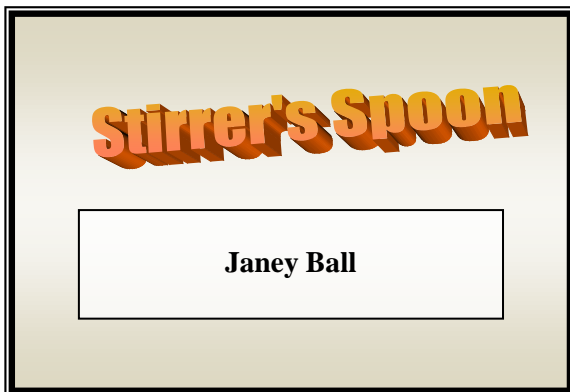
President's Slot

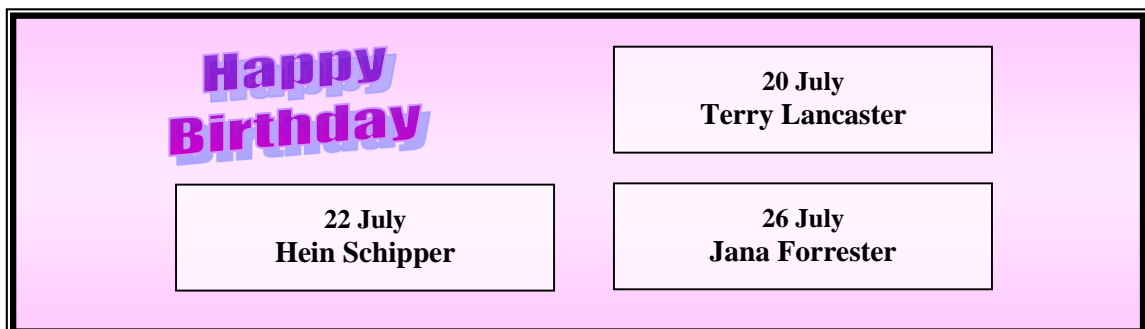
