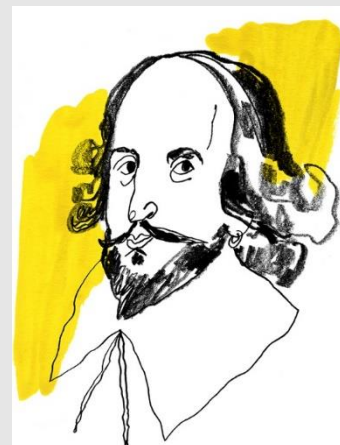

To be, or not to be: that is the question. (*Hamlet*)

All the world 's a stage, and all the men and women merely players. They have their exits and their entrances; And one man in his time plays many parts. (*As You Like It*)

Romeo, Romeo! wherefore art thou Romeo? (*Romeo and Juliet*)

Now is the winter of our discontent. (*Richard III*)

Is this a dagger which I see before me, the handle toward my hand? (*Macbeth*)

Some are born great, some achieve greatness, and some have greatness thrust upon them. (*Twelfth Night*)

Cowards die many times before their deaths; the valiant never taste of death but once. (*Julius Caesar*)

Full fathom five thy father lies, of his bones are coral made. Those are pearls that were his eyes. Nothing of him that doth fade, but doth suffer a sea-change into something rich and strange. (*The Tempest*)

Graham F announced that this year's presidential induction would cost R180 per head and would be on 24th June at the Wild Fig as last year

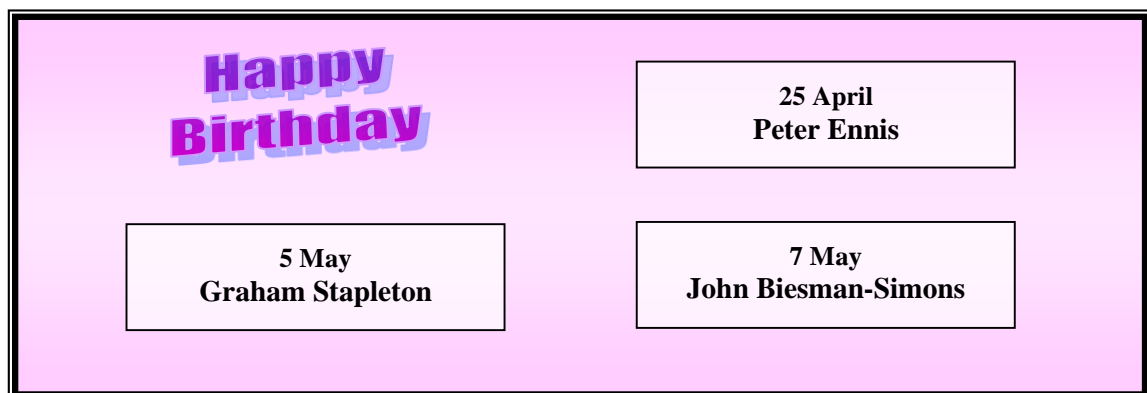
Geraldine reminded the club about the conference and Ian's induction on Friday 29th and that the lunch cost on Saturday is R80. There is no cost to attend the conference.

The Chronicle Herald won six categories at the Atlantic Journalism Awards in Halifax on Saturday night.

The Chronicle Herald received gold awards for 2012 for best page presentation (newspaper), photojournalism feature (newspaper), best profile article (Atlantic magazine), business reporting, commentary and editorial cartooning.

Writer John DeMont claimed top honours for best profile article (Atlantic magazine) for an article on businessman Sir Graham Day that appeared in Herald Magazine.

DeMont also won in the business reporting category for his story Finding a Future in the Oceans.

Associate publisher Ian Thompson won for his comment-

ary Are Nova Scotians Ready Rise to Challenges?

Herald Magazine editor Deborah Wiles, design and multimedia director Jayson Taylor and graphic designer Matt Dempsey won for best page presentation Titanic 100.

Photographer Christian LaFreniere won best photojournalism feature for his portrait of Sarah Atwell, a Windsor-area 16-year-old who has been tormented for years due to her appearance.

Editorial cartoonist Bruce Kinnon also came away with gold award for his editorial cartoons.
