ZONE FOUNDATION NEWS GROWS

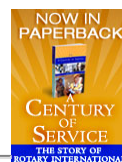

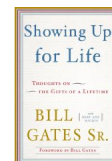


ZONE 24-32 TEAM TRAINING

DDF FOR POLIO

How much DDF (District Designated Funds) has your district donated to the Polio Challenge this Rotary year? The trustees of The Rotary Foundation and President DK Lee asked each district governor to consider a donation of 20% of their district's DDF. The trustees are matching these donation by 50%. Each dollar donated from DDF = \$1.50. Please contact the Zone Challenge Coordinator or RRFC who works with your district for assistance.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO PHF RECOGNITION POINTS

The trustees at their April 2009 meeting amended the pending changes to policy on the transfer of PHF points. The minimum will be 100 rather than 500 points. Effective July 1, 2009 Foundation recognition points will only be transferred for transactions of 100 points or more; the individual donor will be the only person authorized to transfer recognition points and recognition points will expire upon the death of the donor or the death of the surviving spouse of a Major Donor. Club Foundation Chairs should review the Club Recognition Summary report now with regard to recognition points and establish the best strategy to use points of former members or deceased members. They should work with the District Foundation Chair on how to best use recognition points. To transfer PHF recognition points to an individual complete a Recognition and Transfer form and forward to the fax number or address listed on the form.
