**Hello Fellow Rotarians:**

Regarding the upcoming Rotary International Convention to be held in Lisbon, Portugal from June 23 to 26, 2013, many of you have registered already. If you have not yet registered, you should do so now while the cost is still discounted (\$315. until March 15 then the price will go up another \$50. to \$365). The site to register at is: www.riconvention.org

Our Zone is offering a dinner cruise as they have done in past years. The cost is \$70. per person but you will need to register and be placed in the 1st opening plenary session in order to take advantage of this great fellowship event. I will be forwarding more information to those of you that respond that you are interested, or you can go to the Zone website at <http://www.zones28-29.org/> and look under the information for Lisbon area.

I am attending and hope to see many of you there. I will be flying United Airlines out of Albany on June 20 around dinnertime and arriving in Lisbon on the morning of the 21st. The flight costs range from \$1,300. and up.

I am recommending you reserve your hotel in the next few days though as the rooms are going fast (there are plenty of rooms still available). If you would like to stay in the same hotel that some of our District 7190 people are using we are at the: VIP Grand Lisboa Hotel and Spa. Rooms are at 220 Euro (today's conversion shows that 1 US Dollar equals .76 Euro)

Show Reaches 40 Year Mark, Continuing to Give Back to Community

This year’s show marks the 40th anniversary of this important fundraiser, previously called the Home & Garden Show. The Rotary Club expects to raise close to \$100,000 from the event, with proceeds being distributed to community organizations, youth scholarships, and international humanitarian projects. Since the original show was held in 1973 at the Saratoga Armory, the Show has made possible the significant financial gifts of the Rotary Club, as well as strengthening the community spirit of Saratoga.

“The Rotary Club’s goals are to provide a venue for local businesses to reach out to the community, and to create a fun family event during the late winter season. The continued support the Saratoga Home & Lifestyle Show has received from our exhibitors, sponsors, and attendees has enabled our Club to be a generous contributor to a wide variety of local community projects and activities for the past 40 years,” notes Club President Matt Dorsey.

In addition to an annual Major Gift to a local non-profit organization, the Club makes smaller donations to a wide range of local organizations supporting youth recreation and education, food pantries and organizations that serve those in financial need, historical sites, and cultural activities.

As part of the Club’s continued dedication to helping local students pursue higher education, it now provides over \$40,000 annually in scholarships to high school seniors. This work is done in conjunction with the Saratoga Springs Rotary Education Foundation, which raises funds for scholarship purposes.

The Saratoga Springs Rotary Club also assists from time to time with disaster relief efforts, reflecting its belief of being involved global citizens. It also supports the efforts of Rotary International, and in particular Rotary’s effort to eradicate polio.


SUE-JIM-JEANNE-BARB-JOAN-LINDA






