 - The proceeds from the used furniture store downstairs goes to help fund the soup kitchen.
 - Construction began last May and without using licensed trades people
 - The building was considered a fire hazard by the city and fire department and building permits had to be very flexible
- Bread breaking began

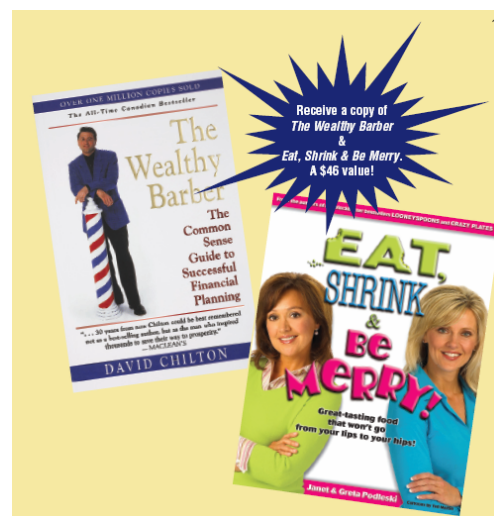
