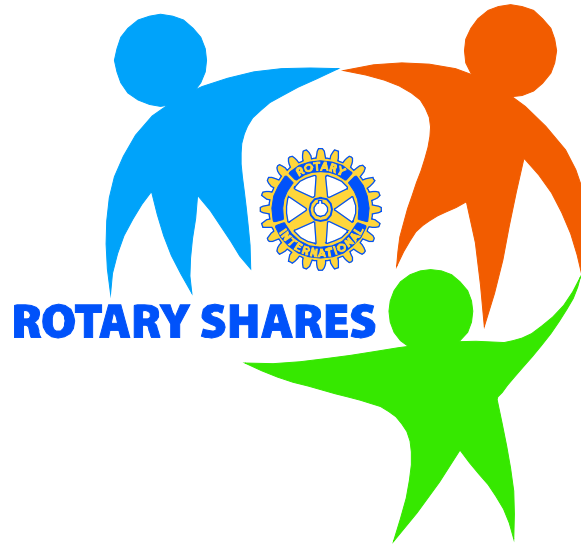

## ***MESSAGE from RI Director MONTY***

Dear Zone 22 Members:

It's been almost a hundred years since P.A.C. (Pac) McIntyre, a young businessman representing the varnish manufacturer, Berry Brothers, returned from Detroit via Chicago to visit his cousin Will Lauder. Will was in the postal service and was a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago. Will told Pac about Rotary.

They had lunch with Paul Harris and Secretary Ches Perry, and then visited headquarters where Pac was given some Rotary literature.

That was about all it took. Pac was so excited about Rotary he came

back to Winnipeg and held an information meeting with his business associates on November 3, 1910. On November 15, 1910 the Rotary Club of Winnipeg was formed.

To anyone acquainted with the precision by which Rotary now moves and the thoroughness of the formula in surveying, organizing and chartering new clubs, all of the history of Canada's first Rotary club seems a little haphazard- little or no instruction, no standard constitution or bylaws to adopt, no gala charter event, no visiting dignitaries, no presentation of a charter. Just a few visionary men clustered around the grand idea of "Rotary".

2010 marks the 100th Anniversary of Rotary in Canada, the country that made Rotary- International. And to celebrate that with the world, Montreal has been awarded the 2010 Rotary International Convention.

For all that past Rotarians in Canada have given us, for all we enjoy in Rotary in Zone 22 today, and for all that Rotary can share in

the future, I urge every Rotarian to catch the vision of this "once in a lifetime" event, and Share Rotary in every possible way to support the 2010 Rotary International Convention in Montreal.

Thank you for what you do for Rotary.
