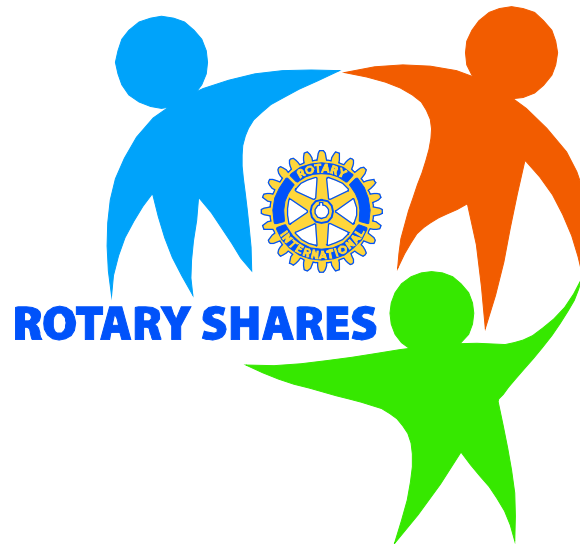

Last Week: Cooking at Household China .

At Household China and Gifts, we were welcomed by our host, the new owner of the establishment, Traudie Kauntz. Traudie has a 42 year history with this business since it's inception but has only recently taken over the reins from her father who is suffering from Alzheimer's.



Traudie was working as an underwear designer for Kenneth Cole when it was apparent that her father could not continue to operate the business. She had to make a decision on the business's future between close it, sell it or operate it. She chose to take over the business to operate it 15 months ago

and has not looked back. She has rebranded the operation as a fun place to be by doing some innovative stuff like adding cooking lesson and wine tasting and remixing the stock away from the china figurines that have faded in popularity. She is proud of their customer service and has made the store an easy place for bewildered males to shop. They have many long term staff that has been with the business as long as 32 years. One of the new additions to the staff is Donna-Marie Pye who is a Home Economist and author of a book that has sold over 300,000 copies. They have also hired a new chef named Mark Seiling (son of regional chair Ken Seiling). Donna Marie is a Ryerson graduate in Food and Nutrition and runs cooking programs for students of all ages (from as young as 7 yrs) in addition to authoring her cookbooks.

Donna demonstrated 2 recipes (with the help of some trusty assistants – Rod Goetz as chief electrician and egg breaker and Tony Maruna as the hot whisker and server).

The 2 recipes Donna made for us were Caramel-Glazed Cinnamon Buns and a Breakfast Focaccia with Scrambled Eggs and Smoked Salmon. Both were

excellent and were enjoyed with a nice Cranberry-Tangerine Sparkling Cooler. The cinnamon buns were meant as a quick preparation morning treat (great for Christmas morning) that does not require yeast rising.



The Focaccia with Scrambled Eggs and Smoked Salmon dish is one that is quite easy to make if you buy the focaccia instead of making it from scratch (note to self-make sure we get a holey pizza pan, available in aisle 7).

Recipes for all of the above are attached in a pdf.

One of the tips I learned was that a recipe is like a blueprint-it is a base on which to start-feel free to make variations and the taste will be different each time!
