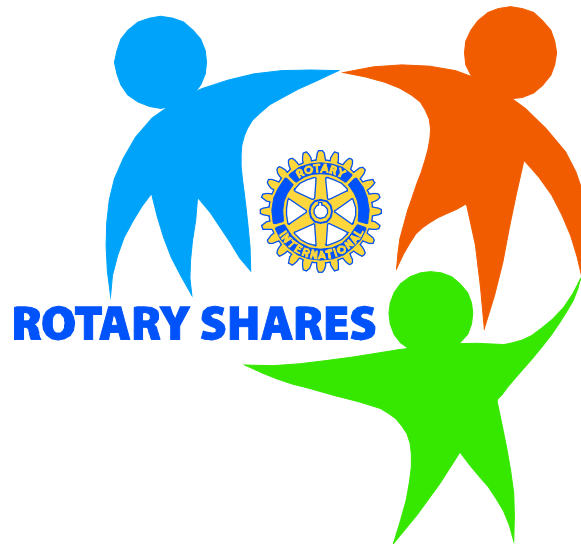

the prize table, making a contribution to buy prizes or sponsor the event.

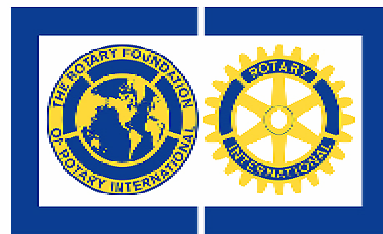
