

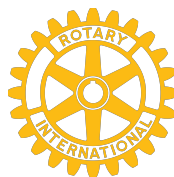
FUN FACTS

The RYLA in D7080 is a fun but intensive six-day leadership training program that attracts individuals (aged **18-26**).

The purpose of RYLA is to

1. Encourage and assist growing leaders, leaders, by providing them with training;
2. To expose young leaders to the ideals of Rotary and encourage its use for service;
3. Publicly recognize the high qualities of young people;
4. Demonstrate Rotary's respect, concern for, and support of youth.

Program overview

The camp heavily favours **experiential learning**. Participants often organize recreational and/ or social events during the camp under tight time constraints for immediate application of skills.

Training topics include:

- The fundamentals of leadership
- Strategies to manage stress
- Building and maintaining self-confidence
