Through our network of Ukrainian and North American NGOs, **ДЕ ТИ Project** supports life-saving missions, psychological recovery, and child protection and rehabilitation.

Our goals include increasing international awareness and fundraising for partner NGOs, developing unified advocacy and communication campaigns, providing digital infrastructure and media support, organizing global events.



Our Partners



Voices of Children, founded by Nobel Peace Prize laureate **Oleksandra Matviichuk**, is Ukraine's largest NGO providing trauma therapy, art therapy, and mobile psychosocial centres for war-affected children.



Save Ukraine works to repatriate children abducted by Russian forces, providing emergency evacuations, reunification missions, psychological rehabilitation, and legal documentation.



PII Telemedicine delivers urgent medical and psychological support to Ukrainian children and families in war-affected areas. Using secure digital platforms, it connects them with doctors and trauma specialists across borders.



Project Soniashnyk hosts rehabilitation camps and year-round support for children of fallen and active soldiers, offering peer bonding, nature experiences, leadership activities, and continuous psychological support.

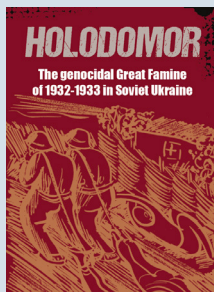
About Ucrainica
