Chalmers	Purchase fridges in order to store more perishable food for their cafes
Rachels Saturday Table	Purchase containers, utensils, napkins etc in order to continue to provide meals to individuals in need
Hospice Wellington	Help cover the cost of grief books for all participants, handouts, refreshments, and the cost for facilitation for the spousal loss support group
The Seed	Purchase items (Hot Plates, Pots, Peelers, Containers) for Up Scale Kitchen to increase productivity of meals and muffins
Sanguen	Purchase snacks and hygiene products for the community Health Van
Salvation Army	Purchase new shelving, storage containers, Floor Mat, Scale and a fridge. These items are required to continue to operate the Salvation Army Food Bank
Arabs Women Society of Guelph	provide workshops, interactive sessions, and community events designed to reduce cultural barriers, foster mutual respect and build social Cohesion
Guelph Chamber Choir	Help cover the costs of acquiring the scores for the concert in February and to cover the costs of a social event
Guelph Guild of Storytellers	Help cover the costs of hosting free story telling events at the enabling gardens
Hope House	The Rotary Grant will be used to purchase high-demand items such as milk, eggs, flour, menstrual products, and adult incontinence supplies. These essentials are often difficult to obtain through daily living.
Stonehenge Therapeutic	Help source materials for Comfort Kits for those experiencing homelessness which include blankets, tarps, hand warmers, electrolytes, sleeping bags, hygiene products, health supplies, food, water
Community of Hearts	Purchase material for the participants of the program to make, package, market and distribute candy. The participants learn tangible skills while generating an income to help maintain the program
Crief Hill	to purchase 4 new bee suits and 4 new sets of gloves for volunteers to use while keeping Bees
Enabling Gardens	Installing a wind phone and a tiny library
Focus On Nature	funding will allow us to deliver low-cost workshops to underserved students, culminating in a public art exhibit
Guelph Black Heritage	the funds would be used to help continue to operate the Phoenix Seniors Club which provides much needed cultural and social interaction, along with educational programming
Guelph Food Bank	opening satellite locations in Guelph . Need equipment for each of these spaces
The Grove Youth Wellness Hub	outreach initiatives designed to make mental health and well being support visible and accessible
Guelph Tool Library	Purchase replacement parts and laptop bags. Guelph Tool library hopes to refurbish and distribute 100 computers to those who otherwise can not afford
Out On the Shelf	To Purchase new Gender Affirming Gear for the Free Exchange program for transgender individuals
Art Not Shame	Help cover the costs to run The Rest and Resilience program addresses a pressing need for restorative, creative spaces for BIPOC-identifying youth and adults (16+) in Guelph.
Children's Reading Room	Help cover the cost of printing a children's book that is a collection of stories and art about Guelph, produced by children
Action Read	Help cover cost of new initiative called 'Creative Writing Group for Mental Health Promotion' to support and promote mental health and well-being while strengthening literacy skills.
