- To improve lives through innovation, data & connected technology, by designing a technological solution to solve a social problem

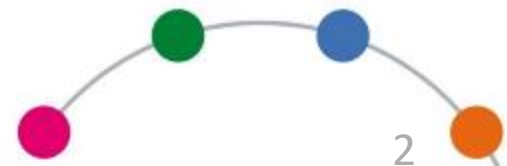
Key dates:

- April 24, 2018: initial proposal submitted
- June 1, 2018: identified as a finalist/recipient of \$250K to finalize proposal
- March 5, 2019: Final proposal submitted
- May 14, 2019: Awarded one of two prizes of 10M
