- Rotary is made up of three parts: our clubs, Rotary International, and The Rotary Foundation. Together, we work to make lasting change in our communities and around the world.

General Information

- The basic unit of membership is the Active Member. All Officers of Rotary including the District Governor and the International President have to be a member of a local Club.
- We also have Honourary Members.
- We also have:
 - Corporate Membership - up to 4 members, only one member will be a voting member.
 - Family Membership - up to 3 members, only one member will be a voting member.
- Club Presidents, District Governors and International Presidents all serve for just one year.
- PolioPlus is a major multi-decade effort by Rotary in cooperation with the World Health Organization and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to eradicate polio worldwide. Many billions of dollars and volunteer hours have achieved a remarkable change. There are only 2 countries in the world that still have active polio cases: Afghanistan and Pakistan. Africa was recently declared Polio Free.
- Rotary became International in 1911 with the formation of the RC of Winnipeg.

Rotary International (RI)

- Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois outside Chicago.
- The current 2023-24 International President is R. Gordon R. McInally
- There have been numerous Canadian Presidents of RI. Recent Canadian presidents include Wilf Wilkinson in 2007-08 and Jennifer Jones of the RC of Windsor-Roseland, who was the first woman President, in 2022-2023
- The RI Board of Directors consists of President, President -Elect, General Secretary and 17 Zone Directors.

Administration

- The Secretariat is the administrative arm of Rotary, serving the needs of individual Rotarians, Districts, the Rotary Foundation and the RI Board of Directors.
- Headed by the General Secretary who is the CAO overseeing the multiple branch offices of RI around the globe as RI Committees, the Council on Legislation and the International Conventions.

Council on Legislation

- This is Rotary's Parliament where each District selects 1 delegate to vote. The RI Board as well as the smallest club in the world can submit proposals to change how Rotary works. All actions taken by the Council must be presented to every Rotary Club for ratification.

The Rotary Foundation

- RI President 1916-1917 Arch Klumph proposed the setting up of a charitable fund. The RC of Kansas City made the first donation: \$26.50.
- Now it manages over \$1 billion USD.
- Canada has it's own Rotary Foundation office for contributions .
- Funds donated are invested for 3 years with interest earned being used to offset the administrative costs of the Foundation.
- Donors of \$1,000 USD are recognized as Paul Harris Fellows. There are higher levels of recognition available as well and many of our members donate annually and have donated multiple PHF amounts over the years. Two of our members are Major Donors.

Club Note: we hold a raffle each year in support of the Foundation. An entry is \$100, and if you win, you can nominate a Paul Harris Fellow!

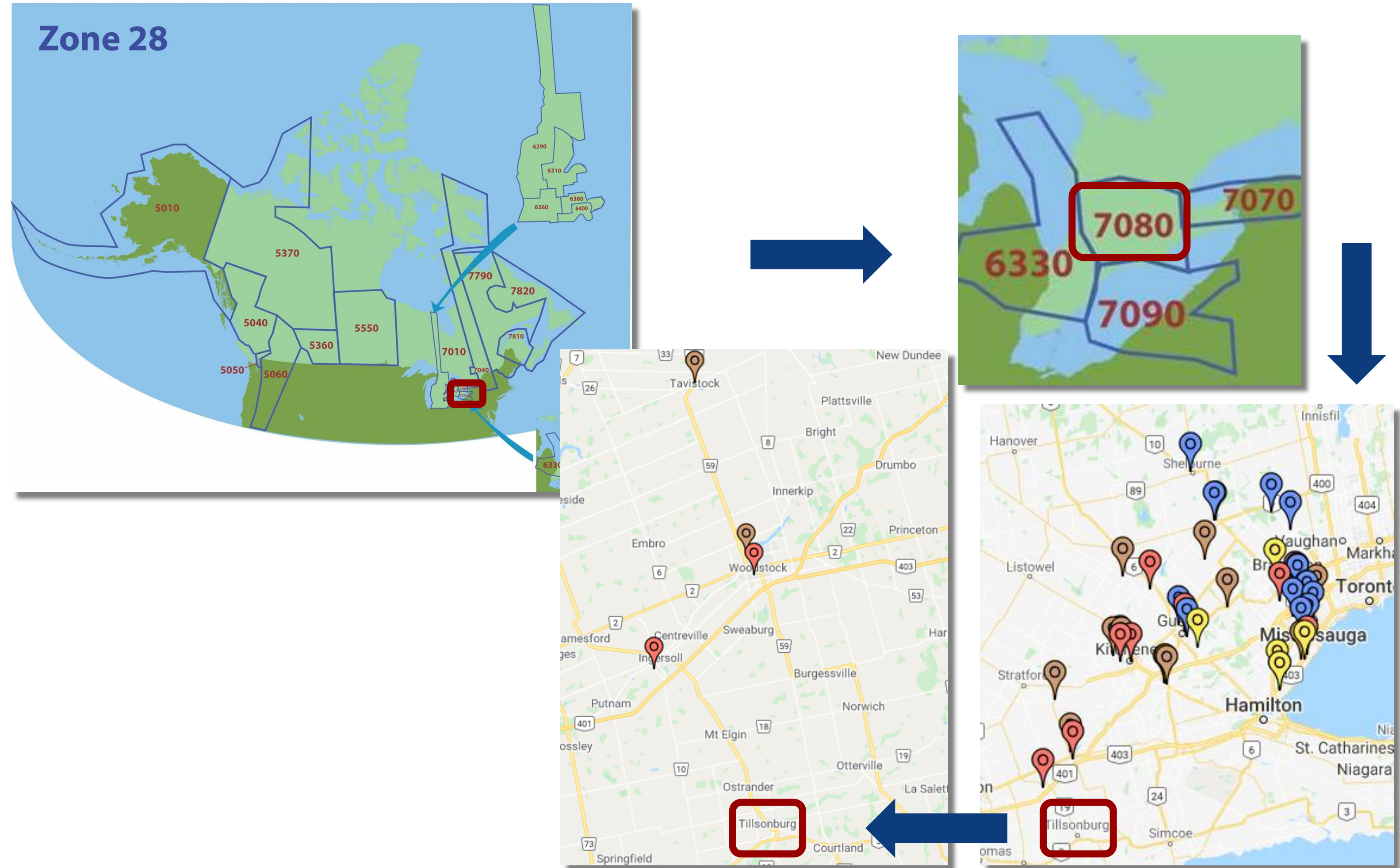

Rotary Structure

- The basic unit of Rotary is the local Club. The Clubs combined form the Clusters and Districts. Districts combined form Zones.

- District 7080
- Cluster Woodstock & Oxford
- Club 4715



The Rotary District - 7080

- District Governor leads the District and is chosen by the District as are the DG Elect and the DG Nominee. This mirrors RI's election structure. John Gilvesy is the most recent DG from Tillsonburg (serving 2018-19) while Don Watkins served as DG in 1991-1992. The executive is rounded out by the District Secretary and the Treasurer. There are 11 Assistant District Governors for each area of the District to help the DG administer the District and to serve as a liaison between the District and the individual clubs. The District consists of over 50 Clubs and 1500 members.
- We belong to District 7080 extending from Tillsonburg to Tavistock and Burlington to Orangeville. The next adjoining District encompasses Toronto to the east and London-Windsor - Michigan to the west.

- Any Rotarian is welcome to attend and it is a gathering of like-minded Rotarians from around the globe. For many, attending their first International Convention is life-changing.
- Rotary business is conducted at the meeting as well as hearing speakers of global stature. There are working groups represented, a myriad of Rotary Fellowship groups at the House of Friendship and opportunities to make new friends and renew old friendships with Rotarians around the world.

Cluster Celebration

- Held annually in the fall. Typically, an evening dinner meeting.
- Opportunity to meet other Rotarians in the area.

Youth Programs Committee

The Youth committee facilitates the following initiatives:

- **Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)** - Training for two young people to develop leadership skills.
 - **Rotary Youth Exchange** - An international exchange for high school students to spend 1 year overseas in another country. We also have a short term 1 month exchange program.
 - **Interact** – Until 2020, we sponsored a club at Glendale High School to enable students to learn leadership and service to others.
 - **Rotary Medals Awards** - Two students at Glendale receive a monetary prize for their leadership and service to the community.
 - **Adventure in Citizenship** - A one week adventure sponsored by Rotary for a student to go to Ottawa to participate in a citizenship program there.
 - **Adventure in Understanding** - A student joins a Rotary canoe trip for 1 week in the Kawarthas along with an equal number of indigenous students as a way of building understanding between these two groups. About 20 people take part in total.



Location & Build

- Located at the Station Arts Centre
- Approximate size: 7ft x 3ft
- Includes a refrigerated section and dry storage area
- Equipped with lighting



Designed to be accessible and easy for all community members to use

Operations

- Available a couple of days a week (initial launch), secured nightly
- Intake and storage supported by Tillsonburg Helping Hands Food Bank
- Volunteer-led stocking, cleaning, and maintenance
- Donations sourced through community and local partners

Frequently Asked Questions

Doesn't this overlap with other food security programs?

No, this pantry is designed to complement existing programs. It is meant to fill gaps in our food programs such as:

- No eligibility requirements
- Access to food outside of existing service times

Are you worried about vandalism, loitering or other criminal activity?

Communities that are operating a pantry have not observed increased issues related to their pantries. We have had detailed discussions with London Community Fridge and have received similar feedback from other organizations we have contacted.

While there is some risk of overuse, the focus is on **helping those in need**. If someone is taking food, it is because they need it.

How many individuals will be supported?

Exact numbers are incredibly difficult to estimate due to privacy concerns.

Similar programs support hundreds of individuals in need.


The demand continues to grow.

Projects - Complete - Honduras Microfinance

Microfinance provides funding to individuals and businesses that would not typically receive support from financial institutions, with the goal of helping them develop sustainable businesses and creating holistic change in their lives. The smallest loans can be for as little as \$50 USD. We have partnered with Opportunity International Canada and funding distribution is facilitated with an organization in Honduras called Instituto Para El Desarrollo Hondureno (IDH) with oversight from local Rotary clubs in Honduras.
