



## Rotary Club of Haliburton

### Funding Guidelines

Funding decisions will be made based on a number of requirements and considerations and should:

1. Relate to ideals, mission, and areas of focus of Rotary International, Rotary Foundation, Rotary District 7010, or the Rotary Club of Haliburton.
2. Exclude any liability to the Rotary Club of Haliburton except for the funding amount of the grant.
3. Adhere to governing laws of Canada and any other country where the activity is taking place.
4. Comply with Conflict of Interest and Conflict of Duty policy of Rotary Club of Haliburton.
5. Comply with current Club priorities, and budgets.
6. Endeavour to provide tools and education to foster capacity for skill development and education.

Funding will not normally be granted to projects or requests for:

1. Projects that are considered to be multi-year support of any one beneficiary, entity, or community.
2. Operating, administration or indirect program expenses of another organization.
3. Unrestricted cash donations to a beneficiary or cooperating organization.
4. Projects already completed.
5. Related to the purchase of land or buildings.
6. Fundraising activities of fundraising organizations which employ paid staff.
7. Humanitarian projects which consist primarily of research data or collection.
