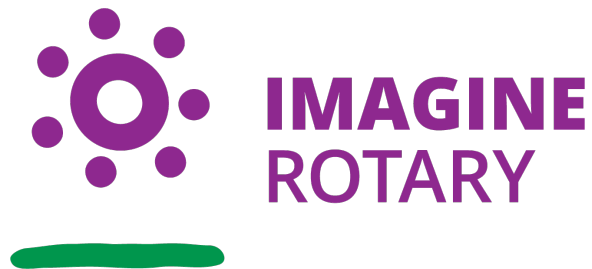

**Program:**

We are happy to welcome Ryan Smith in a return visit to update us about progress on the Memorial Park washroom project to which our club has donated funds. (thank you Lynda Rickard) Ryan, who hails from St. Catharines and is a graduate of the world renowned Niagara School of Horticulture, came to Lindsay in 2012.

He outlined the overall plans for the improvements to the park, often referred to as the “Train Park” on Lindsay Street south across from the building centre.

Ryan explained that the project is multi-faceted and will be completed in parts rather than a total work. In that vein, the upgrades to the tennis/pickle ball courts has been completed as have the changes to the playground equipment just to the west of the courts. Further changes will include a second entrance/exit to the park along with well delineated roads with curbs, renewal of existing picnic shelters, the junction with the Trans-Canada Trail and, a new washroom facility much like the one built at Wilson Fields. The construction of the new ‘*universally accessible*’ washroom facility is expected to begin late spring of 2023. It will replace the original 1970 installation and will be a welcome improvement for park visitors.

DYK that the “Memorial” aspect of the name of the park was originally meant to pay tribute to military personnel who had taken part in the Second War. The memorial was subsequently moved to it’s present location on Kent St. in front of the Public Library.

 Bruce Faulkner joined 57 years ago!

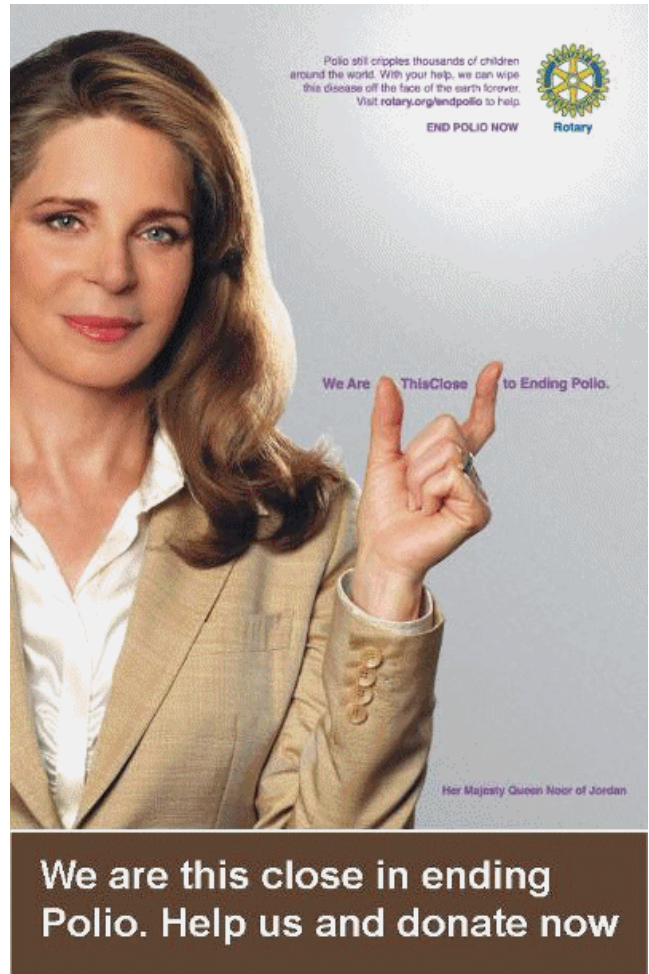
November birthdays include John Coxon who paid \$5 to hear us sing happy birthday 🥳
