



District Governor Club Achievement Award 2015-2016

In order to achieve the District Governor Club Achievement Award for 2015-2016, clubs have to achieve the following:

1. Membership: achieve at least 3 of 5:

- Hold at least 2 membership growth events e.g. potential members are invited to an informal gathering to learn about Rotary; each Rotarian does an “ask”; past members are invited to a meeting and asked to rejoin etc.
- Develop and implement a “better retention” plan in your club e.g. are members greeted and welcomed at every meeting; are new members invited to join a table; is there a mentor assigned to new members; etc.
- Increase membership by net 10%.
- Improve member retention rate by at least 1% from last year.
- Increase fellowship and fun in your club e.g. increase fellowship events from last year; introduce an element of fun at meetings, e.g. birthdays, anniversaries, recognition of Valentine’s Day, Family Day, Rotary’s birthday, St. Patrick’s, etc.)

2. Foundation: achieve at least 3 of 4

- Achieve 100% of Every Rotarian Every Year for your club (each Rotarian makes a contribution to the Foundation).
- Achieve per capita giving of \$195 US per club member or an increase of at least 10% from the previous year.
- Achieve per capita donation of at least \$20 US per club member to Polio Plus.
- Dedicate at least 2 meetings during the year to talk about Foundation and/or about the Eradication of Polio.

3. Online Tool Adoption: achieve at least 3 of 6

- Club President is registered on and uses Rotary Club Central (www.rotary.org).
- Club Secretary is registered on and uses Rotary Club Central (www.rotary.org).
- 10% of club members are registered in My Rotary.
- 10% of Club members have visited Rotary Showcase or Rotary Ideas.
- At least one club meeting has been dedicated to My Rotary.
- Club attendance is maintained online.

4. International Presence: achieve at least 3 of 7

- Participate in a District or Global Grant.
- Provide support to another club in our District with their District or Global Grant.
- Participate in a Rotary Friendship Exchange (includes a club member participating or hosting).
- Participate in Youth Exchange.
- Provide support to another club’s Youth Exchange.
- Participate in International Humanitarian Project.
- At least one club member has attended the 2016 International Convention in Seoul, Korea (May 28 – June 1, 2016).

5. Miscellaneous: achieve at least 4 of 8

- Club committee chairs and/or representatives **for at least three** of the four following areas, **Membership, New Generations, Foundation, and Public Image**, have attended a district educational seminar during 2015-2016.
- A club member attended/graduated from the Rotary Leadership Institute during 2015-2016 Rotary year.
- A club member served as a district officer or an Assistant Governor, or on a district-level committee during the year.
- The club has submitted to the DG, the name of at least one person in their club who is a potential District Leader.
- A minimum of 10% of club members attended the 2015-16 D7010 Conference in Sudbury, September 10 – 13, 2015.
- The club has purchased an advertising spot in the District Conference Program.
- The Club Secretary or Club Treasurer attended the Rotary weekend in April 2016.
- The club has participated in Rotary Youth Leadership Awards by sending a student to RYLA.
