Program: The three finalists for funding from The Major Projects Proposal gave presentations to the Club about the nature of their organization, the proposal, and the amount of money requested. *Jim Stewart* from the Peterborough Canoe and Kayak Club told us that the mission of the organization is to develop healthy lifestyles and character building through paddling activities. He stressed that Peterborough is a unique community of avid paddlers and that this club is a not-for-profit organization and one of 21 clubs in Ontario and 60 across Canada. *Jim Maloney and Susan Sauve* gave us a presentation about the proposal is to build a new pedestrian and cycling river crossing just

north of Frances Stewart Drive that will connect with the Rotary Greenway Trail. Susan stressed that the bridge will be very significant for the health of the community in terms of active transportation. The total cost of the cantilever bridge will be about 2 million dollars and the request is for \$150,000 over four years from our Club. Jacob Rodenburg and Jason Huffman from Camp Kawartha told us that Rotary has a long history with Camp Kawartha. In 1967 we built a dining hall, and in 1985 Rotarians bought the camp and set it up as a not-for profit-charity. Jacob and Jason discussed the various partnerships Camp Kawartha has promoted to develop a Pathway to Stewardship program with an emphasis on sustainable living. The proposal is to build a Rotary Residence. We will have input into the design and name of the building. Total cost will be \$200,000 and they are seeking \$150,000 from our Club. Chairman Joe Hall will work with Ken Tremblay to make the full proposals available on our website and we will vote before September 18th.
