**Sergeant-at-Arms** Amy Simpson asked two questions about Brazil involving the President and its major river. Amy Simpson announced that the Rotarians of the month were Audrey Lakien and Milan Ichnovsky for their efforts at Musicfest.

**Announcements:** *Joe McCulloch* urged members to sign up for the School Breakfast Programme and reminded members of the Food Handling Course on December 3rd. *Audrey Lakien* and *Milan Ichnovsky* thanked all the members and friends who volunteered selling tickets at Musicfest. They announced that after making the contribution to Musicfest the balance remaining for the Peterborough and Kawartha Clubs to split is \$9,418, an increase over last year. *Lloyd Graham* reviewed the plans for the Frank Graham Liberation and urged members to recommend young people to participate in the ride. *Marie Press* announced she is trying to arrange a date for a meeting of the World Community Service committee and urged members to respond to the e-mail. *Jim Coyle* reviewed the Rotary Gold Tour plans with golfers coming from Scotland. He is looking for 12 host families for the 12 golfers. *Peter MacLoughlin* reported that the social evening at Globus Theatre at the Lakeview Arts Barn was outstanding and he also won the 50/50 draw and presented the funds to the club to assist with any club response to the recent earthquake in Italy. *Bruce Gravel* announced the Board is meeting on Wednesday and will discuss participating in the Shelter Box initiative. *Piero Ronca* noted the Shelter Box initiative has been cancelled. Gravel responded this is new information and will be discussed by the Board.

**Programme:** Doug Armstrong introduced the speaker, Ken Tremblay and reviewed this many accomplishments and awards in the area of Health Care Administration.

Ken Tremblay's presentation was on a paper he presented on the changes occurring in Health Care due to the advent of the digital world or Health Care at the Speed of Thought. He reviewed various aspects of the health care system and discussed how it operated prior to the digital age and how the digital age is changing how health care is being delivered. The health of a person can now be monitored in real time and enables patients to become more involved in their health care decisions. Health information can now be easily transferable and monitoring of quality can become more formal. The role of government has changed from a funder of health care to a purchaser of specific health care services with measurable outcomes. Health care is changing from practitioner orientated care to patient centred care. The organization culture of health care has changed from

inward and centralized to outward and empowering. All of this has a major impact of the Organization Structures involved in providing health care. In summary there are many changes which are occurring, and it is changing to a Quality of Care Journey. Management of Health Care is being quickly transformed.

Wayne Harding thanked Ken Tremblay for his presentation of the evolution occurring in health care due to the digital age.
