happen next Monday, June 11, at an evening meeting at the Peterborough Golf and Country Club. The cost is 35 dollars. Other Clubs in our area are not soliciting transfers but are accepting transfers of members. Stan Pineau informed us that the One Roof activity will be tomorrow, Tuesday, at 3:00 and 5:00 pm. Bruce Gravel said that the deadline to let him know if you are going to the dinner/theatre at Globus Theatre is June 14. The event is at the Lakeview Arts Barn in Bobcageon and the play is Lunenberg by Norn Foster. If you have already said that you are going please bring in your money. The cost is \$73.28 per person for the dinner and play. Bruce also used a past-presidential privilege to throw in a Happy Buck. He and Frances will be grandparents in the fall. Ken Tremblay reminded members to check the committee lists to make sure their names are where they wanted them to be on the various committees. Colin McKenzie said that the leftover food last week went to the Casa Maria home for refugees and today it is going to Crossroads and both also involved a donation from our anonymous donor. Susan Sharp let us know that next week we will talk about our international projects, Marie Press will give an update, and we will do an in-club hands-on project.

**Program:** The first item on the agenda was a presentation by two students who had taken part in Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) activities. Hunter Masters and Gabriel Packer were introduced at the podium by Amy Simpson. Gabriel Packer attended an Adventures in Citizenship event in Ottawa for a weekend and thanked the Club for the event of lifetime. He received a Celebrate Canadian Citizenship certificate after the weekend spent with 200 students who did not know each other before the weekend. He sat in on a citizenship ceremony, which was a great honour because people usually cannot attend as observers, visited the Archives, and an aboriginal centre. Hunter Masters went to Orillia for a RYLA three day retreat with about 200 students where he learned leadership skills that he will be able to apply in his future.

The second item was a presentation by students and teachers who benefit from the Breakfast Club

which we host every Wednesday at Prince of Wales elementary school. Peter Cain is the Vice Principal and he read a short speech written by a student, Dylan, who could not attend today. Dylan said he enjoyed the breakfast club because of the good food and the nice people and there were never any bad days. Peter said that the volunteers are there for the kids, not acknowledgement and thanked us for all of our efforts.

The third presentation was by Marina Wilke who is Director of Fund Development for Junior Achievement of Peterborough, Lakeland, and Muskoka. She mentioned that her father, Eric Wilke, was member of this Club for many years. She showed a video and then gave an overview of what Junior Achievement does. It opened in 2007 in Peterborough and its mission is inspiring students and preparing them to succeed in a global economy by participating in financial literacy, work readiness and entrepreneurship programs. There is no cost to the students or schools and the organization actively tries to reach out to rural students. JA programs are delivered by dedicated volunteers from businesses. Marina outlined programs at the elementary and secondary level and brought samples of products produced by students in the program. Two local major events are World of Work and the Business Hall of Fame.

Meeting adjourned at about 1:15.
