Program: Dr. Jennifer Ingram was our guest speaker. Jenny graduated from Queens and specialized in geriatric treatment. As a busy lady, she recently received the Glenn Sawyer award! Jenny is President Allan's last speaker as president and spoke about aging and dementia. We are living longer – children today can expect to live: 80 for men and 82 for women in BC and Ontario. 20 percent of Peterborough's population are seniors. 80 percent of people with dementia are not diagnosed. It's the undiagnosed disability that inspired Jenny to start her Memory Clinic. GAIN clinics are: geriatric assessment and intervention networks and are situated nearby and other locations in Ontario. Dementia has various causes and Alzheimer's is the main cause of dementia but not the only cause. Dementia is not normal aging. There is evidence to show people who develop Alzheimer's can be identified early. Lifestyle choices can help to avoid dementia, even though genetics play a big part but exercise, diet, sleep, socializing, reducing stress, not smoking all have positive affect on memory loss. Avoid narcotics, sedatives, benzos, alcohol and trauma.

Please support the Senior Showcase this Wednesday at the Wellness Centre. The "Alive Inside" documentary is a great one to watch. She gave a "Shout out" to Rotary for helping more seniors enjoy music!

Dr Ingram was thanked by Andi for her leadership and for what she has developed in our region. Thanks Jenny, On a personal note it was a fascinating talk and I really appreciated the presentation today.
