Program: Colin MacKenzie introduced Carey McMaster, a representative from Ontario Works at the Innovation Centre. Carey introduced our speaker: Carissa McIntyre. Carissa related her "journey through hell" to becoming a writer. Now a self-published author, she has produced three books of adult erotic fiction in just one year! A single mother of 4 (3 of hers and 1 adopted), she had always wanted to write. In March, 2017, she selfpublished her first book, Cuffed, all by herself, including the cover. (Your humble scribe can attest that's quite a feat!) She wrote two more books in quick succession as she dealt with a traumatic upheaval in her life: leaving an abusive relationship and staying at the YWCA Crossroads Women's Shelter. She went into the Ontario Works program at the Innovation Centre, where she met Carey, her mentor. She took classes at the Centre and created a business plan, resulting in establishing her own publishing house in November, 2017. Her latest novel, Heist, just came out last month. A Peterborough native and graduate of Kenner & Trent, she had a B.Sc. in Fish & Wildlife Management and a B.Ed. She worked for MNR for 36 years, mostly up north, and was also a teacher. She retired in 2014. She had started a second career: Ontario Dog Trainer was her business. She was a certified trainer and dog food specialist. She also regularly visited local nursing homes with her therapy dogs. She had been instrumental in leading the fight to save Boyd Island in Pigeon Lake from developers, culminating in ownership by the Kawartha Land Trust in 2015, so it could stay wild forever. She was a member of the Women's Business Network and was on their Dragon Boat team.
