Our Speaker was Detective Keith Calderwood of the city police, introduced by Peter Norris.

Keith was previously in our downtown specialist group, where the training was focused on "breath, smell, drugs and mental awareness".

This was good old fashioned person to person policing. But in our new world unfortuntely there are new forms of crime and policing.

Keith is now in the Fraud Prevention section. He outlined the most common fraud schemes currently in our area. There are many!

Fraud is actually theft, but through false pretenses.

Scams such as:

Emergency scams on grandparents. A fake phone call regarding a grand child with sudden police problems.

Home renovation scams such as; needing a new roof, a new driveway paved, all with the offer of a Special Price since they are in your neighborhood.

The sale to you of what is actually stolen goods. Often at a price too good to be true.

Kijiji: Internet sales where money is prepaid but the product is never delivered. Caution here.

Telemarketers: who offer inspections and sale of a variety of services.

Identity theft: which is very common from a purse, wallet, or even house garbage! This can result, for example, in your data being used to take out credit cards, which are often easily given out by store chains and banks, based on your data. Buy a low cost shredder! The same data can be used for 2 or 3 or more credit cards. As of today, there are 38 known scams in our local area.

Internet scams: Be sure that you have a top security program on your computer. Many scams are not local.

Rotarians are far too smart to be fooled by such fake schemes? Not so! Keith is aware of many top professionals who have been scammed, including police officers themselves!

Fake phone calls? Why debate with some one who is likely far away? Just hang up.
