Past President & Assistant Governor Rick Storey said the 7th Annual Spelling Bee would be on Saturday, May 12, at Fleming College. All are invited to attend either the morning or afternoon sessions. He distributed cards with really hard words (thanks Ray Saitz!) that we all must learn to spell before next meeting, or else.
