Programme: Stan Pineau introduced today's speaker Stephanie Burlien-Hall who described her Rotary Exchange Student experience in Rhodesia (Zimwabee) during 1974-75. Stephanie grew up in Sault Ste Marie, graduated with BSc in nursing and later completed a Masters in Adult Education and for the past 25 years has been a Nurse-Educator in the Sunnybrooke O'Dette Cancer Centre where she worked with Diane Pineau. Stephanie was 17 when she left Canada to spend a year in Rhodesia which was her 1st choice. She was hosted by 2 clubs, Chiredzi & Fort Victoria (now Masvingo) where she attended school graduating with a Senior Matriculation diploma. At that time Rotary was still an all male bastion with wives being members of "The Inner Wheel" as Rotary-Anns! Some of her memories include seeing a lemon tree, a Rotary tour thru the Kalahari desert, a 3 day canoe trip beside crocodiles and hippos, 35° C Xmas Day, and a visit to Victoria Falls. Stephanie was proud to represent her home, Rotary, and Canada. She has lost contact with her hosts and friends because of the political turmoil since independence. Stephanie was thanked by Rick Storey who mentioned that Eric had represented our club last year in Finland.Bruce closed the meeting as usual with this joke. 2 elderly friends were sitting on a bench when one asked the other why he was getting a tattoo. "To have my name and address in case I forget!"
