Programme: Todays speaker, Diane Chen introduced by Peter Norris is the Property Development and Special Project manager for the Canada Cham Shan Temples headquarters in Markham. There are 4 local Buddhist Gardens sites: Wutai Shan-Ski, Hill Road, Bethany; Putuo Shan, 4 Lifford Road, Bethany; E'mei Shan, Ballyduff Road, Bethany and Jiuhua Shan, Pontypool Road. The Wutai Shan site is the 1st to be developed with construction starting in 2007 and will continue for another 20 years! The temple building using a 1000 year construction technique will consist of a gift shop, offices and a restaurant on the ground floor. The roof is onsite and is designed from a sacred temple in China. Buddhism is not really a religion, more a way of life. The temple plans to integrate in the community by using local tradesmen, forming a partnership with Fleming and Trent and providing alternative healthy lifestyle activities for e.g. Tai Chi, vegetarian food. In closing, Diane mentioned that she was a Rotoract member in Hong Kong 50 years ago. In answering a question about wind turbines she said that construction will still proceed. Diane was thanked by Andi Van Koeverden.

In closing President Bruce reminded us that **there is no meeting next Monday May22** and President Elect Andi will chair the May 29th meeting. His final remarks were "Silence is golden unless you have grandkids, then silence is very suspicious".
