**Guest Speakers:** The following three men from the Peterborough Utilities Group were introduced by Doug Armstrong – Dave Patterson, Dave Bignell and John Stephenson, President and CEO.

An excellent power-point presentation was provided so to avoid repetition in this bulletin Doug Armstrong will provide an e-mail

attachment of the presentation that you can review. Therefore, this bulletin will contain abbreviated information.

Dave Patterson said that there was a lot of misinformation in the community about the sale of the Peterborough Distribution Group (PDI) to Hydro 1 that he and his colleagues thought our members would like to receive some information. (Again, check that power point presentation for much more detail.)

Dave said Ontario's electricity system involves Generation, Transmission, Distribution and Consumers. The OEB (Ontario Energy Board) regulates all licensed distributors regardless of ownership. The Peterborough Utilities Group (PDG) provides electricity generation in the form of development and operation, metering and unregulated services, water treatment and distribution through PUC and Riverview Park and Zoo. With 170 employees, 35,000 customers PUC returned \$70 million to the city since 2000 with \$5.34 million returned in 2015.

Dave Bignell said Hydro 1 is the lone distributor of Transmission which means delivery of your services. In 1990 there were 307 electrical distributors and in 2016 there are 50 or so distributors so changes to delivery is emerging and will affect consumers, so much so that in the next 5 years it is expected that your hydro bill will have risen by about 40%

John Stephenson said that we have 36,000 customers surrounded geographically by Hydro 1 so will there be a retention of employment and/or bring jobs to this area in any future changes. A proposal is that Hydro 1 plans a large Operation Centre in this area providing an extra 30 jobs, in addition to 70 Hydro 1 jobs and the retention of PDI employees. The purchase price of PDI to Hydro 1 is set at \$105 million and that could mean a reduction of hydro distribution rates of 1% and a freeze of distribution rates for the next 5 years. In years through 6 to 10 Hydro 1 can ask the OEB for a rate increase. The sale transaction could net the City \$50-\$55 million and the community value would be \$100-\$150 million.

After some questions from members, Ken Tremblay thanked our speakers for their presentation. The facts and figures can be overwhelming and you are probably wondering how this will affect you in the months and years down the road, so John invited anyone to call his office for further clarification.

**Bruce concluded the meeting** with his quote of the day... Common sense is like deodorant....those who need it the most, don't use it!
